






Weekly Rainfall Forecast

- Moderate rainfall predicted over Gedo region of Somalia. These rains represent the actual onset based on climatology.
- Light rains are expected over the southern part and very isolated areas in the North western part of the country.
- **Dry conditions** expected in Puntland.



Shabelle & Juba River Levels



- Currently river level along Jubba and Shabelle are above average for this period of the year.
- The Shabelle river is at high flood risk level. Along the Juba, the levels are dropping although they remain above the long term average for this period



Impacts of Past and Forecast Weather

Even though light to moderate rains are expected over Somalia, the heavy rains predicted (forecast Map 1) over Ethiopian highlands will sustain the rising river levels in both Juba and Shabelle

The rising river levels can therefore poses a high risk of flooding in the towns and its surrounding

Open breakages pose a great risk with floods occurring in Buurfulle, Raqayle, Misir, Doonka, and Shiidlo Bari villages

The population living at the low lying areas and flood plains along the shabelle river should take precaution

The forecast light to moderate rains moderate temperatures throughout the country are likely to lead to partial recharge of surface water sources and vegetation regeneration which is important for human and livestock survival.

Communities are encouraged to take advantage of the onset rains and harvest water specifically over Gedo region.

SWALIM and partners are following the developments keenly, and will keep you updated

Voluntary Displacements in Beletweyne

Following early warning alerts and continuous government and humanitarian partners' sensitization to the riverine

communities, some of the villages have started to voluntarily move safer areas to avoid being flooded and cut-off from
