3	<p><b>FSC Response Overview – May 2023</b></p> <p>The Food Security Cluster response for the reporting month of May 2023 was presented by the different strategic objectives and by district. A total of 15 partners collectively assisted about 319K people under SO1 while 9 partners assisted 138K people under SO2. **4 Nutrition-Relief Referral Programming in Hirshabelle State – Nutrition Cluster**

Nutrition Cluster and Food Security Cluster have been supporting the Nutrition to Food Relief programming by providing a neutral coordinating platform to facilitate the referral of malnourished U5 and PLWs to Food Relief partners so they can receive food assistance. The success of this programme is a priority to both clusters and partners engagement and commitment is therefore a major factor.

The Nutrition Cluster Coordinator made a presentation on the overall progress, challenges, and recommendations to ensure this programme is a success. Below are some excerpts of the presentation.

Main objective

- The FSC and Nutrition cluster partners to use the harmonized, standardized referral template together with practical guidance for enrolling households with acute malnourished children and PLW into Relief interventions in the state.
- Address food security related underlying causes of malnutrition.

Target

- Children under-five currently enrolled in Stabilization Centers (SC), Outpatient Therapeutic feeding Programme (OTP), or Targeted Supplementary Feeding Programme (TSFP)
- Pregnant and lactating women currently enrolled in TSFP.

Key Challenges

- Low Referral of households with SAM and MAM under-fives and PLWs to humanitarian food and cash assistance.
- Duplication/ overlaps in assistance :Nutrition to Relief referrals data duplicate.
- Delay of Nutrition Beneficiary registration into Scope system since 31st March,2023 due to FLA and new TSFP and Relief partners selection process.
- In adequate resources: like Scope Equipment was the main challenges of not enrolled all the nutrition beneficiaries referred into the WFP relief partners.
- Capacity related challenges: CP capacities and meeting high quality standard program implementation was also another challenges
