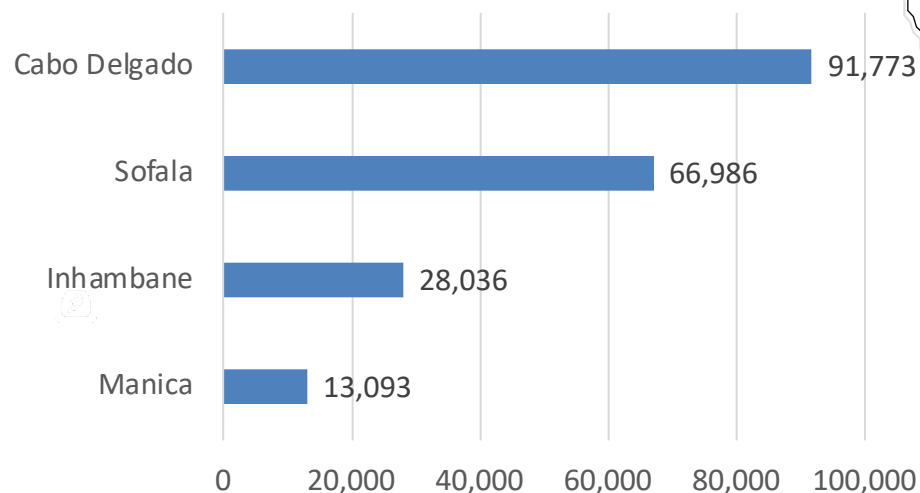
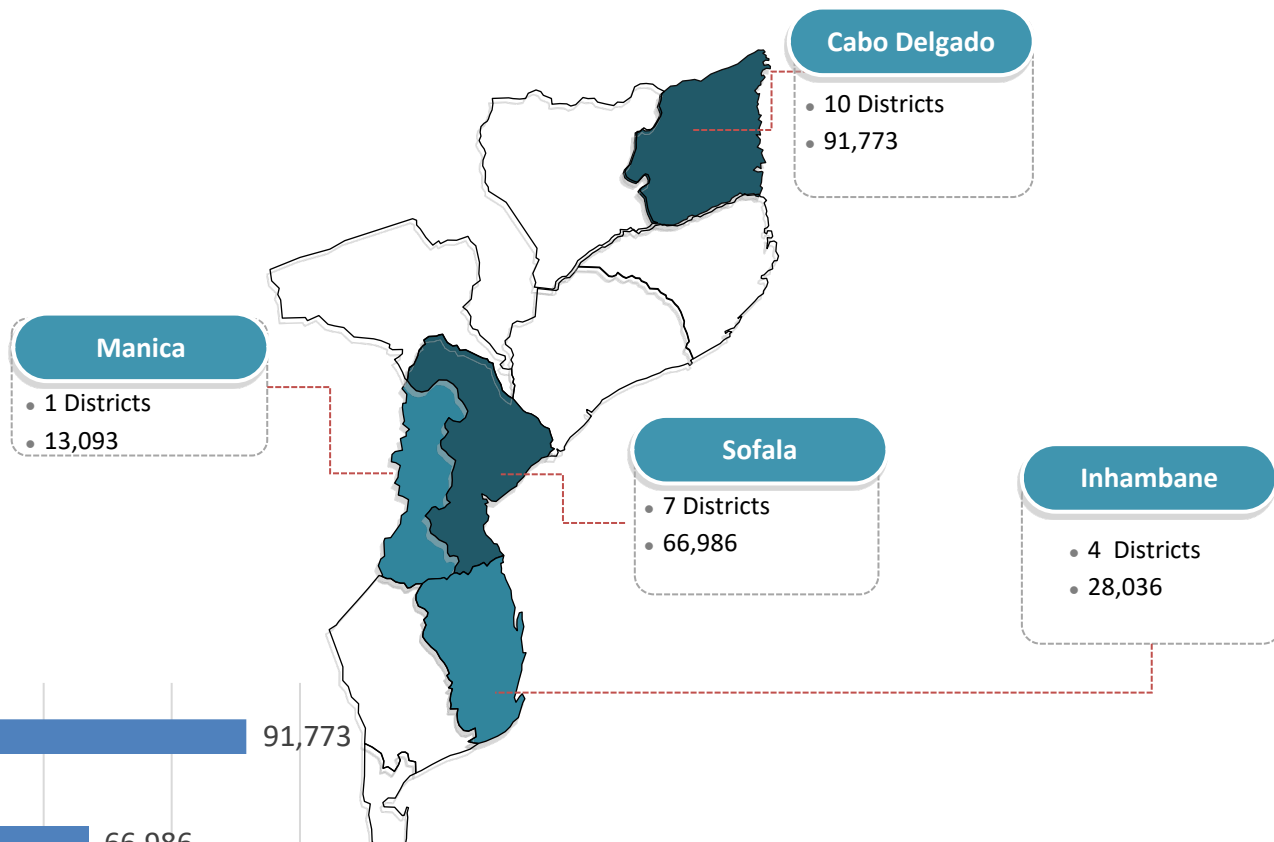


Cluster Wide Reporting: Food Assistance #s by Province

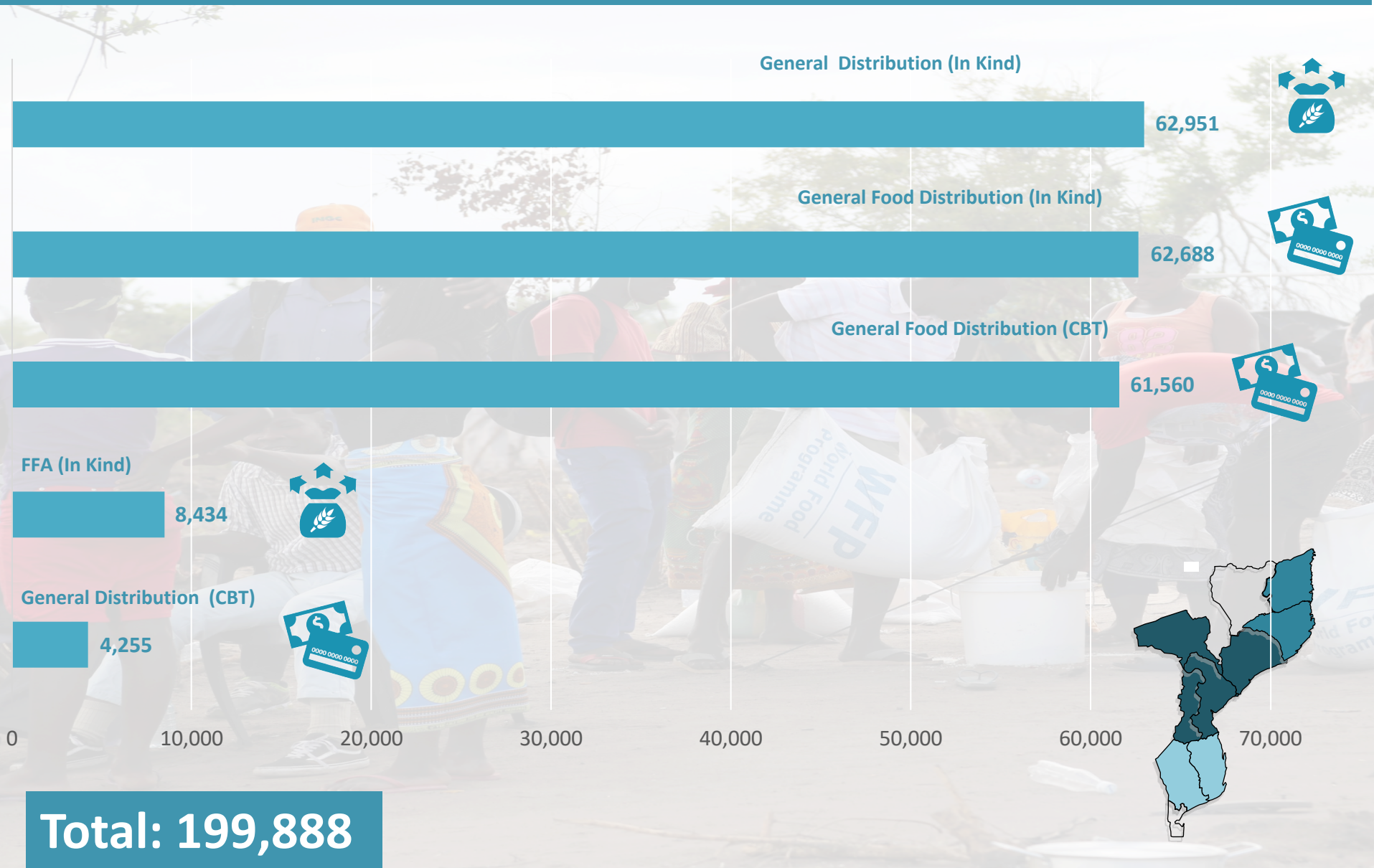

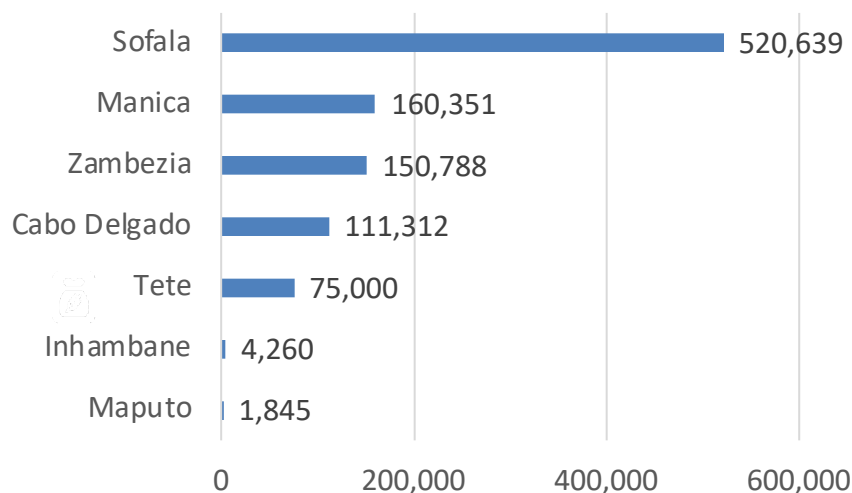
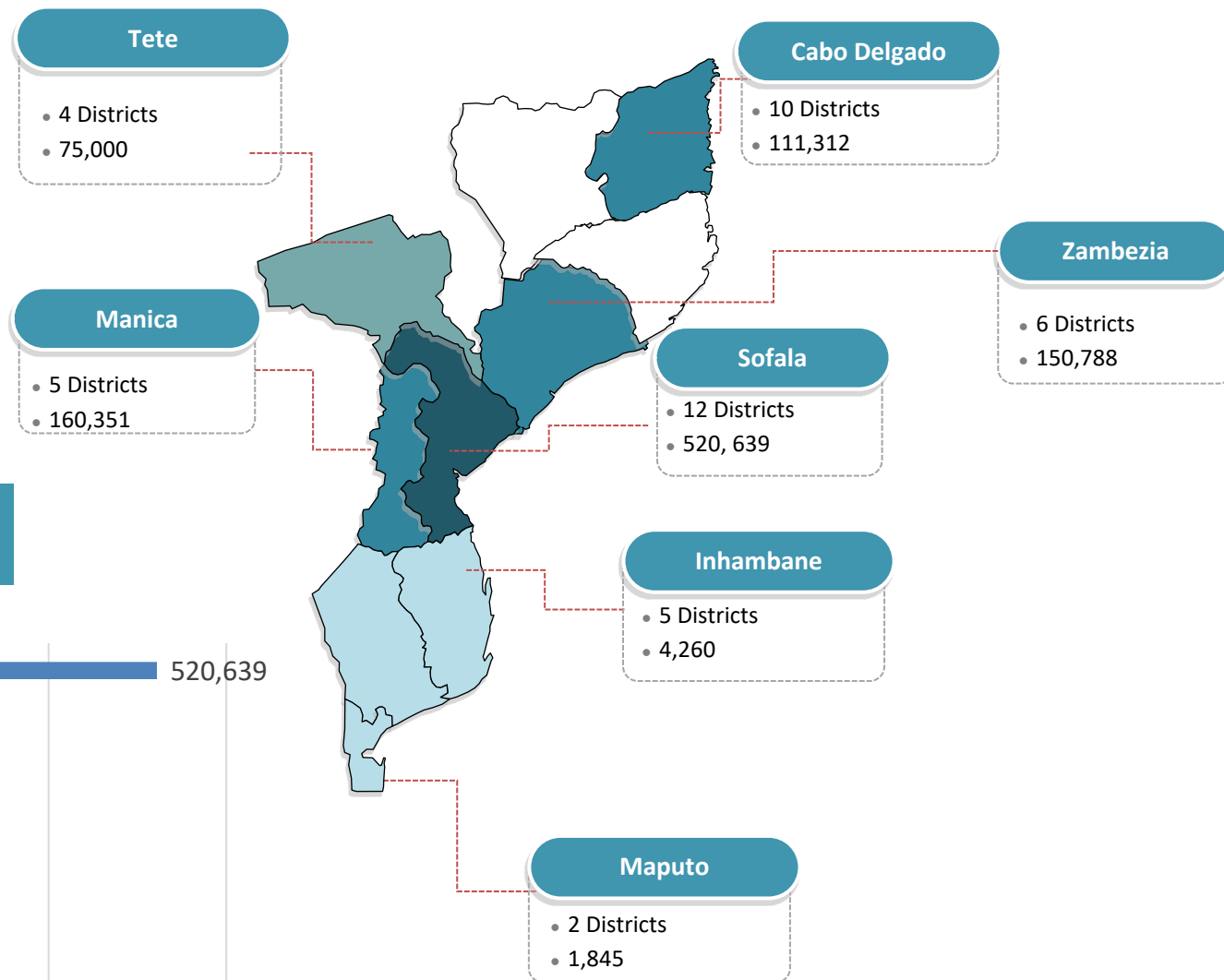


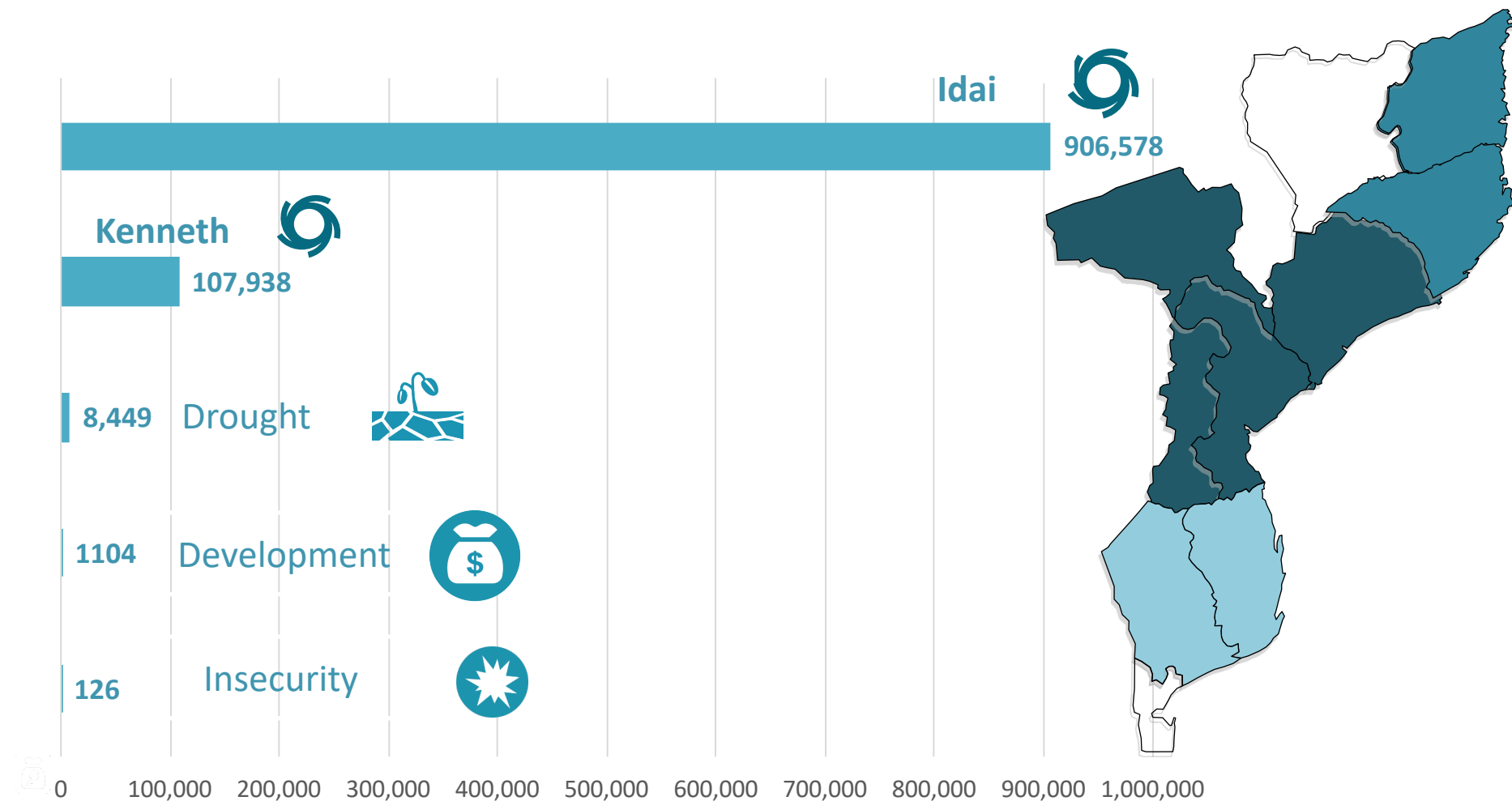
Cluster Wide Reporting: Livelihoods #s by Province

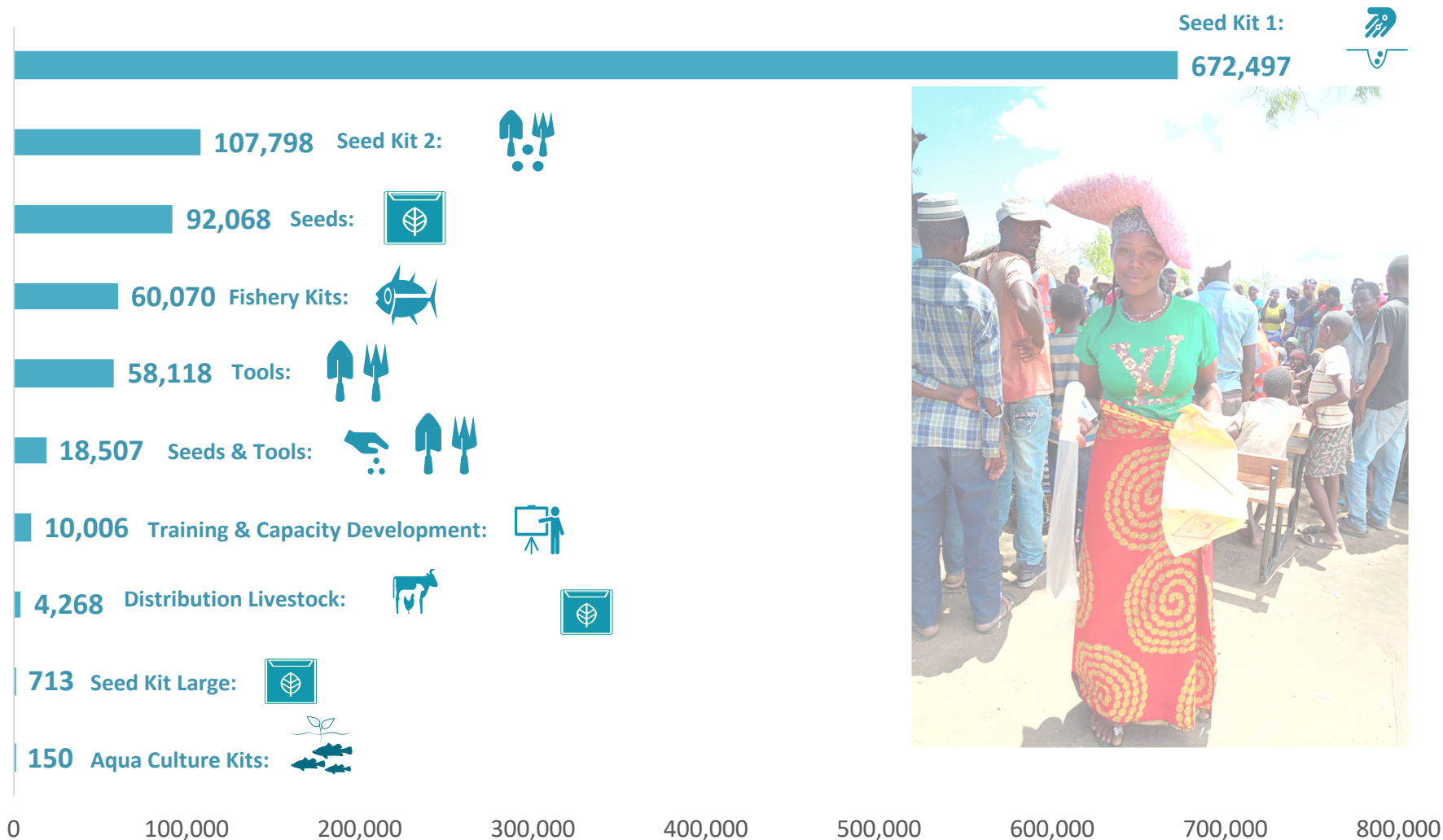

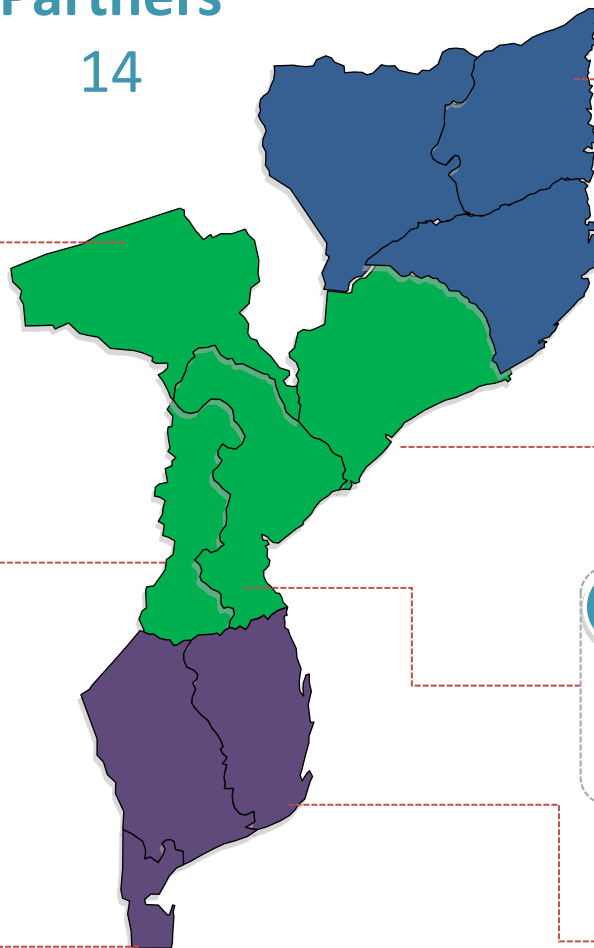

COUNTRY RESPONSE UPDATE

An estimated 1.9 million people, in 63 districts throughout Mozambique, face severe food insecurity and require urgent humanitarian assistance (SETSAN IPC analysis and projections, April 2019 to February 2020). The key drivers of the food insecurity are conflict (northern); residual effects of the cyclones (northern and central); floods (northern and central); and droughts (southern and central); exacerbated by recent Covid-19 pandemic country wide with 2.5million people (country wide) estimated to be food insecure.

Recently, conflicts have escalated causing massive displacements beyond Cabo Delgado Province to Nampula and

Niassa provinces. In addition, a third consecutive drought hit southern parts of the country resulting in failure in the main cropping season(2019/20). The simultaneous and consecutive shocks have left vulnerable affected populations with limited options of coping.

The priorities of FSC is to provide lifesaving food assistance to vulnerable populations experiencing severe food insecurity and help restore livelihoods to shock affected people. Currently FSC partners are reaching up to 70% and 65% of the planned beneficiaries with food (monthly) and livelihoods (cumulative) assistance respectively.

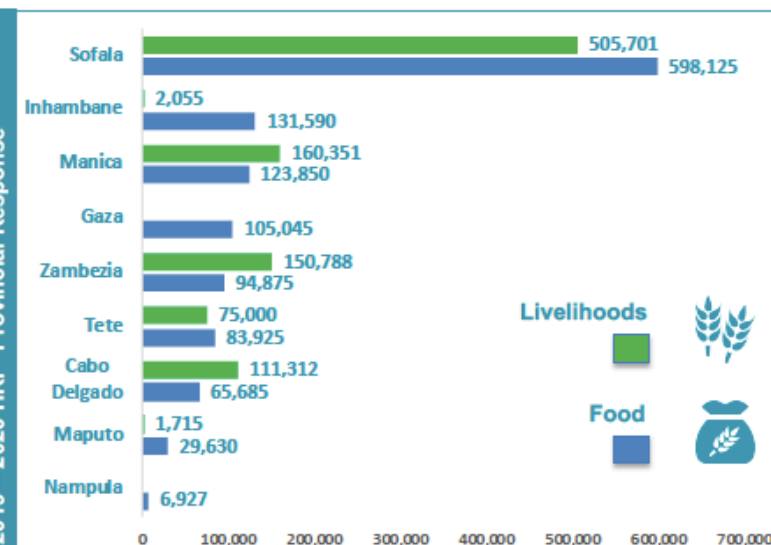
