Peste des Petits ruminants (PPR) or goat plague is an acute, highly infectious small ruminants associated with high morbidity and mortality that can kill 80-90 % of the herds, the disease is more server in goat with mortality that can reach 80-90 of infected herds  The disease is one of the priority diseases indicated in the FAO-WOAH Global Framework for the Progressive Control of Trans-boundary Animal Diseases (GF-TADs).
