

In April 2023, the food security sector assisted 1.9 million people with food assistance and around 122 thousand people with agriculture and livelihoods, of which 69 percent (1,293,328) and 30 percent (36,117) respectively received support, through cash voucher assistance (CVA). A total of 21 organizations, national, and international non-governmental organizations, and UN agencies used various delivery mechanisms such as cash payments, mobile money transfers, paper vouchers, and electronic vouchers. Borno state hosts 86 percent of the CVA beneficiaries, with Yobe state hosting 13.9 percent and Adamawa state has 0.1 percent.

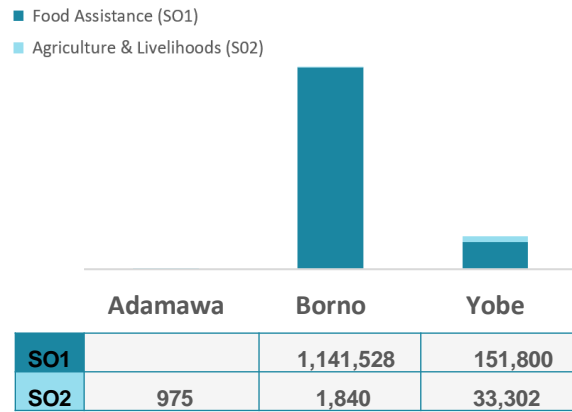

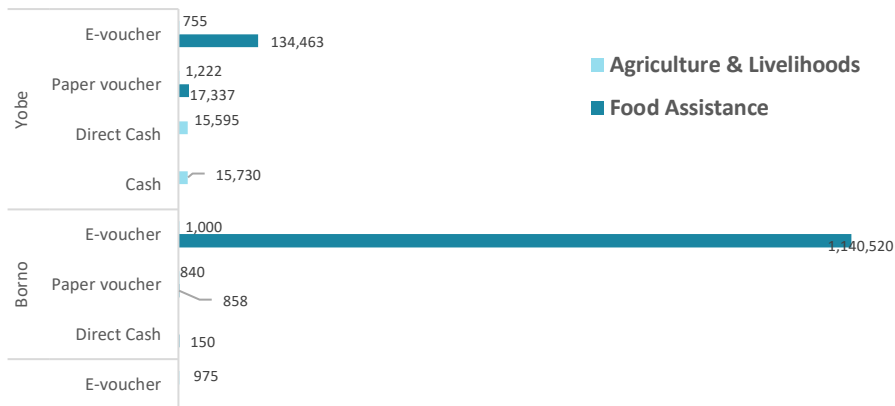

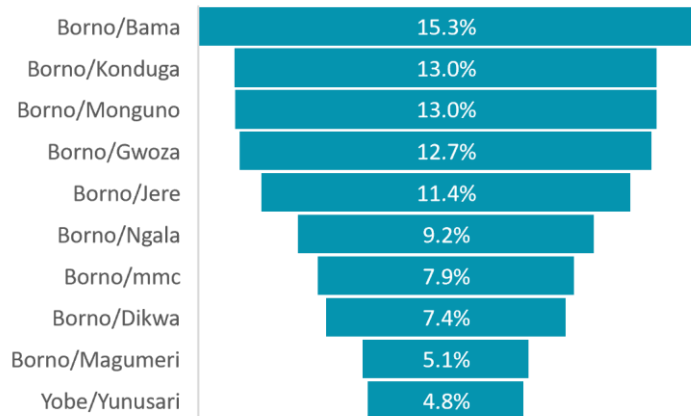
**Cash & Voucher Assistance at State Level**
