

Tools to Mainstream Gender

- Gender Tip Sheet- it is a summary of possible key-recommendations, organized by each area of Programme Management Cycle in any programme. It can be used as practical guidance on how to implement gender-responsive programmes.
- Gender with Age Marker The GAM is a reflective learning tool to encourage thought and discussion of project designers by the people who design and monitor projects and programs. It is a tool that asks users to consider and discuss how gender differences are incorporated and addressed in their project or response plan.





Gender Mainstreaming in food security

Use Gender Tip Sheet Food Security

- Collect and analyze sex, age and disability disaggregated data (SADDD).
- 2. Conduct a participatory gender analysis, e.g look into gender roles and power dynamics, decision-making power, access and control over resources, cultural norms and practices, mobility of women and girls and protection/Gender based violence (GBV) risks.
- 3. Reflect gender analysis in the planning using SADDD, consult with women, men, girls, boys, and other at-risk groups (LGBTQI, elderly, persons with disabilities, etc) to design these activities to ensure they meet their needs.
