Revitalizing Poultry Ventures: ZOA's Latest Development



Brief Overview:

- **Donor:** Nigerian Humanitarian Fund (NHF)
- **Location of Intervention:** Jere/Monguno
- **Number of Targeted Beneficiaries:** 600 Households
- **Duration:** 12 months (Nov 2022- Oct 2023)



What we intended to do (the Goal)

- ❑ To Build the resilience of 600 conflict affected IDPs and Host community in Jere and Monguno on poultry management and production, through the provision of livelihood assets (in kind distribution of birds) and knowledge to increase assets productivity



Mapping out our dynamic activities towards goal attainment

- Procure and distribute 3,000 16-week-old Noiler/Indigenous birds to 600 households in male-female ratio of (1:4) with 10% estimated mortality rate.
- Train Community Based animal volunteers (CAHVs) and beneficiaries on poultry management and production.
- Cluster each communities into smaller groups for smooth monitoring by CAHVs.
- Procure and install two solar hatchery machines.
- Train beneficiary on hatchery management.
- Assessment of existing poultry housing, train and provide tool kits to establish improved structures



What we did

- a) Engagement of qualified veterinary consultant from the University of Maiduguri to train and develop training manual and guide beneficiaries and community animal health workers in Monguno and Jere.



Cont'd

b) Identified and trained 9 community-based animal health Volunteers (5) in Jere and (4) Monguno and provided them with service kits



Training

- ❑ Trained Project participants on Poultry Management & production.
- ❑ possibly ways of identifying early signs of diseases



Quarantine

- ❑ Birds were quarantine for four days
- ❑ The Birds acclimatized and vaccinated using Lasota strain against Newcastle



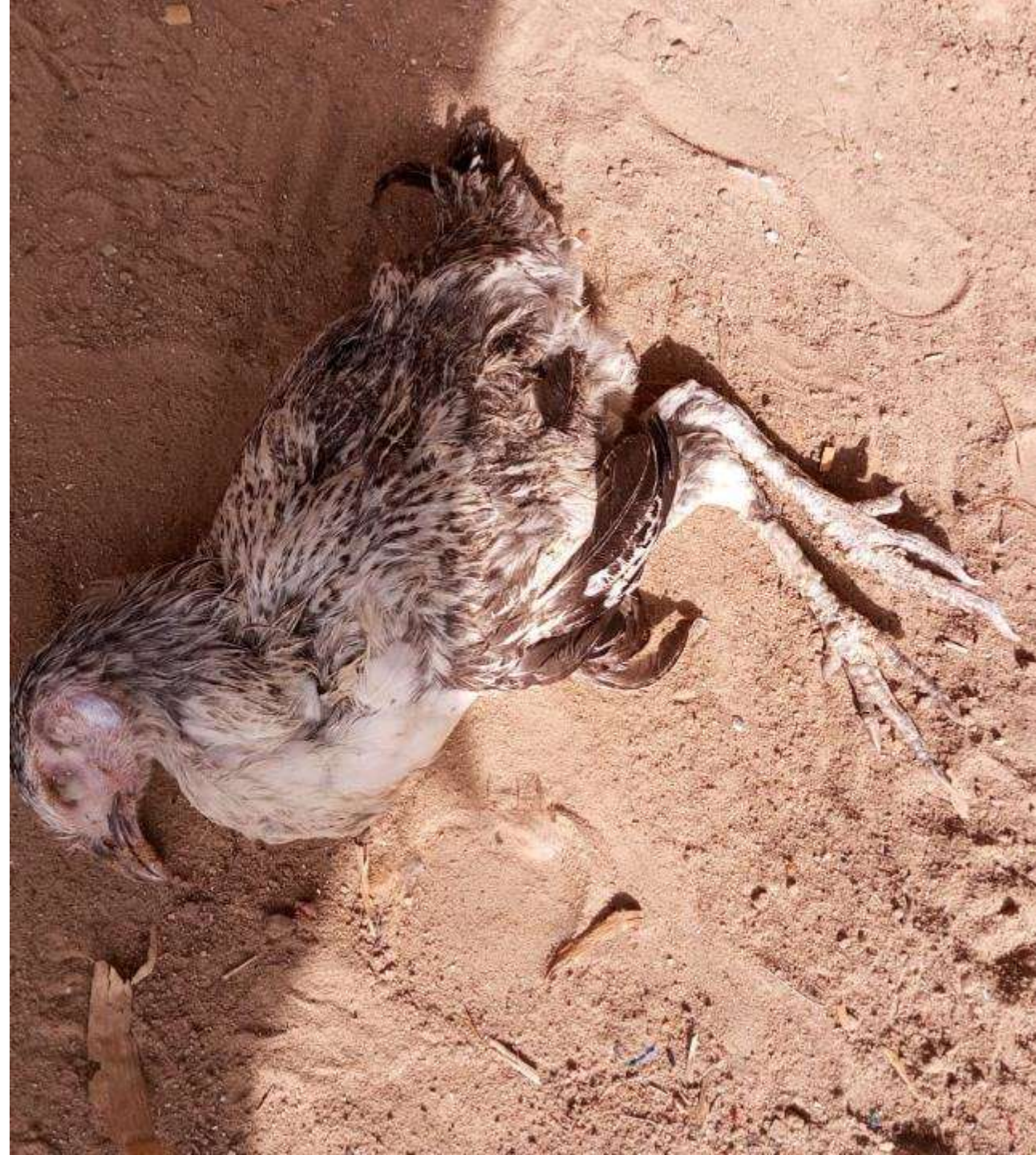
Distribution of Poultry Kits

- ❑ Distributed poultry 1:4 (4 hen & 1 cock) to 250 households in Jere.
- ❑ Distributed 250 poultry kits (feeds, Feeder and Drinker) in Jere



Challenges

- Mortality of birds after distribution in Gongulong Jere LGA.
- Some Project Participants selling their birds after they have received



Success/Result

- Though is rather too earlier to have a comprehensive report on this, interim report shows that some of the birds have started laying eggs.
- Both ZOA Staff, CAHVs and Project Participant were equipped with the necessary knowledge and skills in small livestock management and production.
- The Project participants were taught on the importance of poultry production and how to identify early signs of disease in animals.
- Both ZOA staff and the CAHV's has knowledge towards providing technical assistance to communities on small livestock management and production was improved.
