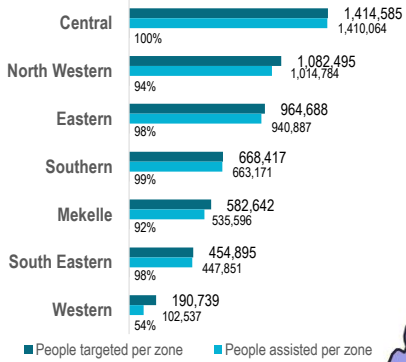


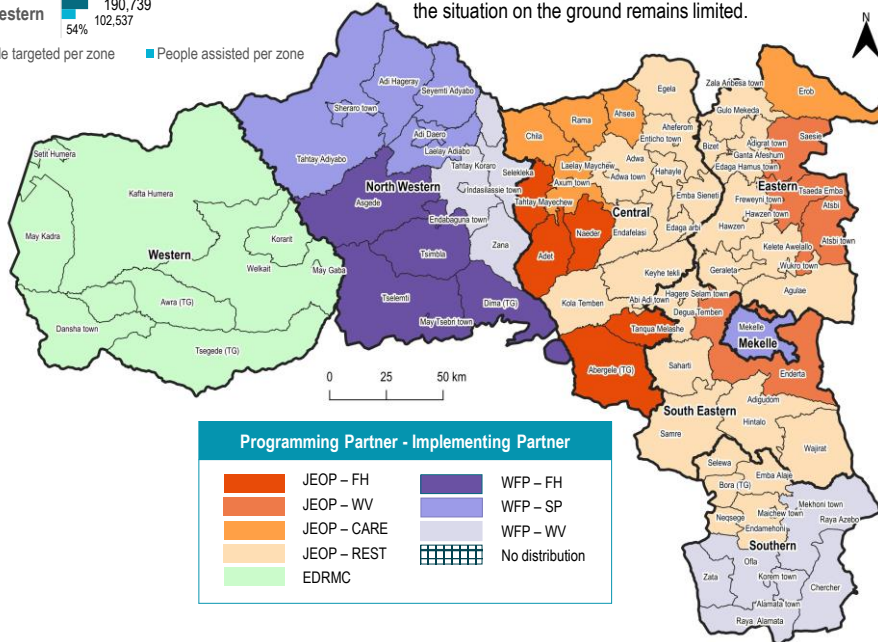
## 5.1 MILLION PEOPLE ASSISTED SINCE LATE DECEMBER 2022

5.4 million people targeted for Round 3

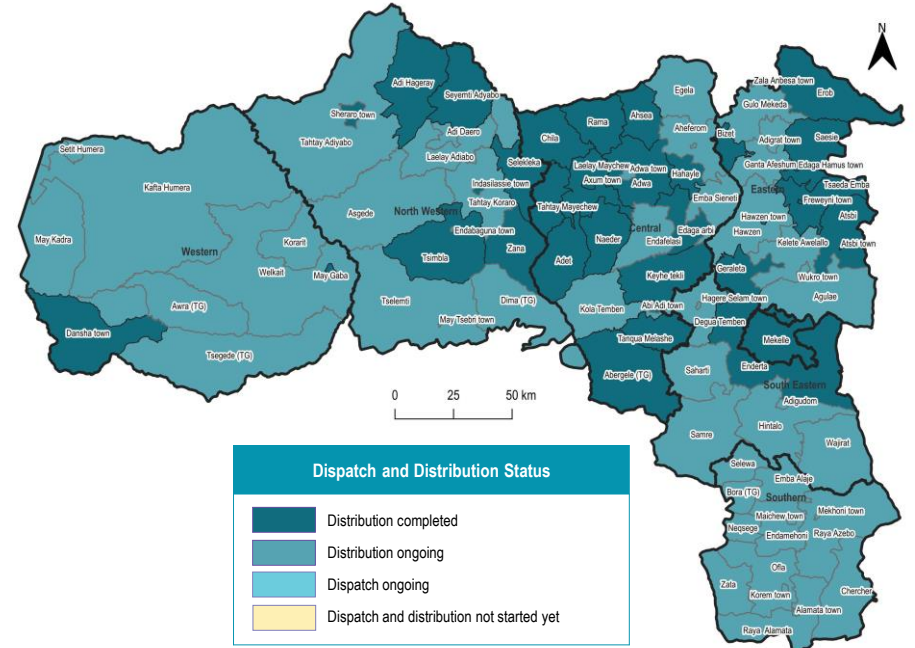


Round 3 distribution of 2022 was launched in late December 2022. Partners have assisted 5,114,890 people (95% of the total planned caseload of 5.4 million people for the region, including Western Zone) with 86,496 MT of food.

Among the main partners, JEOP partners assisted 3,062,660 people (99% of its planned caseload of 3.1 million people) with 51,912 MT of food; WFP and its partners assisted 1,949,693 people (93% of its planned caseload of 2.1 million people) with 33,046 MT of food; and it was reported that EDRMC assisted 102,537 people (54% of its planned caseload of 0.2 million people) with 1,538 MT of wheat in Western Zone. Western Zone is inaccessible for most partners while information about the situation on the ground remains limited.



## FOOD DISPATCH AND DISTRIBUTION AS OF 22 MARCH 2023



Since mid-November 2022 when humanitarian food supplies resumed to enter Tigray, more than 170,100 MT of food has been brought into the region as of 27 March; and around 157,400 MT of food (for Round 2 and 3 of 2022 and Round 1 of 2023) has been distributed to around 5.2 million people as of 22 March.

Between 16 - 22 March, a total of 369,783 people were assisted with 6,267 MT of food in Tigray – 364,447 people assisted with 6,177 MT of food under Round 3 of 2022 and 5,336 people with 90 MT of food under Round 1 of 2023.

Round 1 distribution of 2023 was launched on 19 March, and partners have started distribution in Mekelle -5,336 IDPs were assisted with 90 MT of food as of 22 March.

In Central and Eastern zones, due to access constraints and infrastructural damages resulted from previous conflicts at some food distribution points, as of 22 March, distribution for around 159,000 people of Egela, Zala Anbesa town, Gulo Mekeda and some kebeles in Erob took place in neighboring woredas, including Adigrat town, Aherferom, Bizet and Enticho town; and in North Western Zone, partners have not been able to assist 9,800 people in Dima due to access challenges.
