<b>Welcome &amp; intro</b>	Welcome to Peter, new SAG member, working with Plan International. Peter is based in Kampala (to be considered also time difference when scheduling meetings, etc.).		
<b>SAG MEMBERS</b>	the 2nd slot of SAG members was not filled yet: one organisation has withdrawn application at the last minute and another expression of interest was done. Since we could not find a new SAG members, it was decided to launch another EoI early January, with a letter that would better describe the role and scope of SAG's engagement (to motivate organisations to apply), but also current SAG members should be pro-active in reaching other NGOs that might be interested	<b>Davide to edit the message and SAG members to connect bilaterally with other NGOs</b>	high
<b>FSC partners meeting</b>	General consensus that GPM was well balanced in terms of presence, thematic areas, speakers, time for Q&A it was also appreciated that there were not too many topics which has allowed focus and discussion in the break out rooms. Unfortunately the survey was not filled by many (about people only out of more than 100 participants). There is a need to attract more organisations (partners) to contribute to discussions at the GPM - now that there is a very high "competition" with parallel virtual meetings and online webinars, the GPM needs to be seen as a platform that welcome all but also allow active involvement of the partners (e.g. breakout rooms discussions, pre-GPM survey to decide the Agenda etc.). Save the date and Agenda should be finalised earlier if possible as well as the date can be also re-discussed since end of November/early December is a very busy period. Another suggestion is to involve NGOs at Director General level in order to create a momentum and raise interest for other food security experts within the same NGOs to join the GPM. Since the GPM has always been in presence in Rome, and since 2020 due to the current pandemic is held online, a strategic shift/approaches/tools needs to be re-discussed or reconsidered in order to accommodate presence as well as ensure active participation from the field/region/HQs.	<b>Final report to be published</b>	high
<b>GHO/Presentation - debrief</b>	WFP and FAO agreed to provide gFSC an opportunity to present and advocate for FSC needs for 2022 at their donor briefing (part of a series of activities related to GHO launch). It was agreed that one NGO SAG member would present on behalf of gFSC but unfortunately due to personal issues, this did not happen. Naouar and Abdul Majid have presented as the Global Cluster coordinators. The event went very well and presentation from the gFSC was well appreciated by the donors. It was recognised that more advocacy and fundraising needs to be done for gFSC and not only through collective initiatives (e.g. GCCG), and also according to the "weight" of the gFSC compared to other clusters. this issue will be discussed early next year with the SAG together with other priorities.	<b>Final PPT to be sent to SAG members</b>	high
