OUTPUT DESCRIPTIONS

Output 1.1: 10,983 HHs vulnerable household identified, verified, registered and received assorted vegetable seeds and tools (5,600 HHs in Leer, 2,033 HHs in Gogrial West, 917 HHs in Malakal and 2,233 HHs in Fashoda) benefiting 64,700 people in Leer, Gogrial West, Malakal and Fashoda Counties (13,321 men, 16,404 women, 18,235 boys and 16,740 girls).

Output 1.2: 10,983 vegetable farmer households are trained and carrying out dry season vegetable farming and post-harvest management

Output 2.1: 10,983 HHs household are identified, verified, registered and received simple fishing gears (5,600 HHs in Leer, 2,033 HHs in Gogrial West, 917 HHs in Malakal and 2,233 HHs in Fashoda)

Output 2.2: 10,983 households are trained and carrying fishing to provide animal protein to household diet and are able to preserve excess fish effectively

MAIN ACTIVITIES

- Formations of PMCs for AAP as complaint and feedback mechanisms
- Training, and orientation of the AAP committees to assist during beneficiaries registration, verification and inputs distribution
- Identification, Selection, Registration and Validification of the target beneficiaries
- Inputs and supplies were procured and distributed
- Demo gardens were established and managed by volunteers under supervision of extension workers
- Training of lead farmers and fisher-folks' groups
- Monthly ,monitoring visits and 1 PDM
- The project was successfully closed on 7th May 2022

KEY CHALLENGES

- The funding allocated for the project was grossly inadequate compared to the overwhelming needs we met
- The process for disbursement of project funds to facilitate implementation was slow
- The procurement process of inputs was centralized and it took longer than expected for the vendor to deliver the supplies.
- The budget for transportation of inputs was grossly underestimated by all partners.
- Movement of project field staff to the target locations was difficult. More so, the targeted locations were hard-to-reach
- Only water transport was available for transportation of staff and inputs with exception of Gogrial West County

LESSONS LEARNED (FLOOD RESPONSE CONTEXT)

- For best quality seeds, IPs should be allowed to budget and procure seeds (The quality of seeds we procured was excellent)
- IPs should apportion more funds for transportation and distribution of supplies. The use of water transport is very expensive. Hiring of local canoe for a day is between \$80 and \$100
- At every stage of the project, IPs must constantly conduct robust community engagements (community meetings, AAP sessions etc.)
