1 - Humanitarian Updates

Displacements & Conflicts

- From Jan Mar 2023, 4,390 people across two Darfur states were displaced due to conflict. On 23 March, inter-communal violence erupted in the Tandulti area, Ag Geneina locality in West Darfur state.
- 7 states were affected by conflicts with North Darfur, West Darfur and West Kordofan reporting the highest number of incidences.
- 30,000 people (women, children and elderly) fled across the border into Chad from WD unconfirmed reports indicated.

Diseases Outbreak

- Dengue fever has spread to 84 localities across 12 states and a dengue fever outbreak was declared on 14 February 2023 by the Sudan Ministry of Health.
- A total of 2,600 confirmed dengue fever cases while 45 deaths were reported due to dengue fever until 25 March 2023.
- 179 measles cases and 433,264 malaria cases were reported from Jan Mar 2023.
- WHO is supporting the Ministry of Health to respond to the outbreak.



Funding Updates

- The 2023 HRP has an ask of US\$1.75bn, and as of March received \$225.7m 13 per cent of the requirement.
- The FSL Sector funding requirement under HRP 2023 is 437.5M, funded 148.3M so fare with the remaining gap of 290M (66%).
- At the end of March 2023, the Sudan Humanitarian Fund (SHF) allocated over \$9m to respond to new and/or worsening emergencies and prepositioning of stocks.

Launch of CERF Underfunded Allocation (US\$18M)

- There has been a steady increase in prevalence of intercommunal violence and displacement incidents in Sudan, as well an increase in IDP numbers.
- The number of incidents increased by a third and the number of IDP's by 42 per cent in 2022 compared with 2021.
- In response, the 2023 UFE CERF allocation targets the most vulnerable among the newly displaced population, in the areas most affected, with lifesaving activities, targets the causes of intercommunal violence and displacement and enables a rapid response in the coming year.
- Complementarity between CERF and SHF is highly considered
- Proposals are underdevelopment by agencies, deadline is 15 April 2023.

4. CFSVA 2023 Updates – WFP

- Data collection completed end of March (prior to start of Ramadan);
- 37,816 HHs surveyed in 181 localities in all 18 states of Sudan;
- Preliminary Analysis indicates that the main drivers continue to be:
 - Economic downturn, limiting HHs access to food;
 - \odot Conflict-induced displacements;
 - \odot Climatic shocks, resulting in disruption or destruction of livelihoods capitals.
- In depth analysis ongoing, with comprehensive presentation of findings provided at next FSL meeting.








6 - CCPM 2022 Findings CORE FUNCTION 2 - Informing Strategic Decisions of the HC/HCT
