



# Harmonised Markets Monitoring: Weekly Price Monitoring

## Introduction

This report provides an update on food basket commodities availability and prices. It covers the period from the 13<sup>th</sup> to 17<sup>th</sup> April and is based on interviews with **630 traders** in **145 markets** across **40 districts** ( 33 rural and 7 urban ). Annexes 1 to 3 explain the trends arrows in the highlights.

## Economic Conditions

This current week marked the third week of the government mandated lockdown in response to COVID 19 which has been extended an additional 14 days. Furthermore government introduced relief cash transfers to the most vulnerable in both rural and urban areas in an effort to ease the pressures of COVID 19 on livelihoods. About 1million people are expected to benefit from this scheme.

Exchange rate have been relatively stable over the past week (13th to 17th April 2020) fluctuating between ZWL49:1USD and ZWL49.5:1 USD for electronic transfers on the parallel market over the course of the week. The market for bond notes followed the same trend starting off at ZWL35.70:1USD and closing the week at ZWL36.10:1USD. The official exchange rate however remained unchanged at ZWL25:1USD. An analysis of nominal and real prices in the market suggests that prices are being pegged to parallel market rate for electronic transfers. This means that the majority of households without access to USD are likely to see their incomes increasingly eroded aggravating their vulnerability if salaries are not reviewed to meet the gap caused by the increasing rate of devaluation of the local currency.

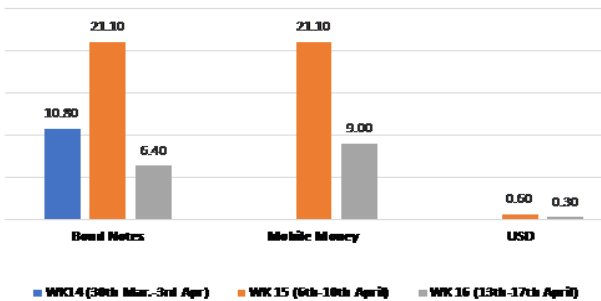

## Maize Grain - Availability and Prices

This round of market monitoring shows indications that maize grain is generally unavailable on the market as evidenced by only 3 rural districts i.e. Makoni (ZWL 12.40/kg), Gokwe North (ZWL4.80/kg) and Kwekwe (ZWL8.31/kg) reporting positive answers on availability. In urban markets maize grain was unavailable and this could be attributed to the challenges in moving the commodity from rural markets as a result of the lockdown. Under this circumstances cash based transfer programs should rely on maize meal on it's estimating the food basket as it is the more readily available cereal to ensure beneficiaries are able to purchase enough in both urban and rural areas.

Figure 1: Maize grain week on week price Rural districts

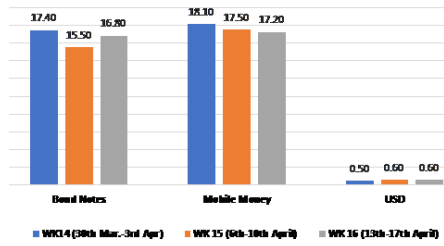


## Maize Meal - Availability and Prices

This week's maize meal availability increased on average by 6% , while prices increased by 10%. Improvements in availability are driven by a steady supply of government subsidised maize grain to millers for production of unrefined maize meal in all districts.

### Urban Domains

Figure 2: Maize meal week on week price

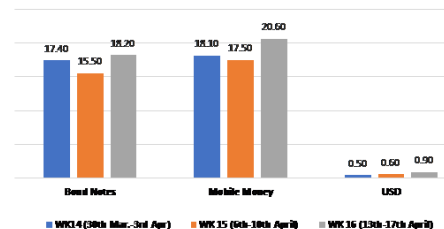


◆(The demand for maize meal on the market continues to increase as availability of maize grain has continued to deteriorate. The current market availability of unrefined maize meal increased this week to 55% from 51%. This is indicative of an improvement in market supply of the commodity.

◆The average price increased by 8% from ZWL 15.50 to ZWL16.80/kg for bond note payments with no significant change in mobile money payments. (See annex 8)

### Rural Districts

◆Market availability of unrefined maize meal increased week on week from being available in 28% of the markets to 32% in rural districts.

◆There was a further price increase in maize meal prices this week with prices increasing by 17% and 18% for both bond notes and mobile money payments respectively. USD prices also increased from USD0.50/kg to USD0.90/kg. (See annex 7)



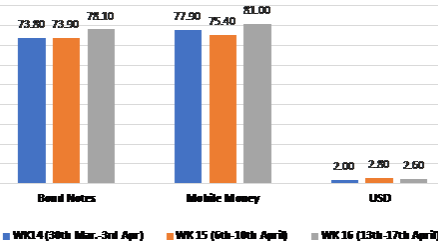


## Sugar beans - Availability and Prices

Sugar bean availability remained relatively stable at 38%. The average price for the commodity in all monitored markets increased by 19% from ZWL62.50/kg to ZWL 74.60/kg

### Urban Domains

Figure 4: Sugar beans week on week price

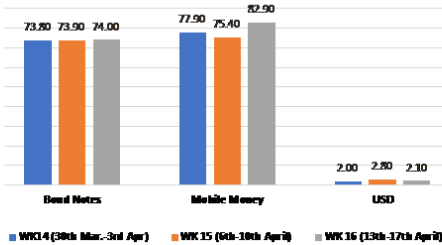


◆ Availability of sugar beans was relatively stable with marginal (insignificant) increase of half percentage point to 43.5%. All monitored markets in Mutare and Harare urban districts reported no availability of the commodity on the market.

◆ The average selling price of sugar beans in the monitored urban districts increased by 8% and 7% for bond note and mobile money payments. USD prices on the other had decreased on average by 20 cents per kg in the current week ending 17 April 2020. (See annex 10)

### Rural Districts

◆ Sugar beans was available in less markets, only in 38% of the markets which is similar to the 39% reported for the last reporting week.

◆ About 5 districts reported unavailability of the commodity while 2 districts had availability in all markets.

◆ There was a 10% increase in mobile money prices over the last week (13th-17th April 2020), while bond notes prices remained unchanged.

◆ Highest prices were recorded in Hurungwe (ZWL110.00/kg) and Insiza (ZWL 109.30/kg), signalling reduced supply against higher demand in these two districts. Marondera had the lowest price ZWL40.00/kg most likely because supply outpaces demand within the district from this year's harvest. (See annex 9)

## Background

The harmonised weekly market monitoring is being conducted by WFP in partnership with members of the Cash Assistance Working Group (CWG), including World Vision International, CARE, Oxfam, Aquaculture Zimbabwe, Caritas Zimbabwe, Christian Aid, GOAL Zimbabwe, HOCIC, Mercy Corps, IRC, ORAP, Zimbabwe Red Cross Society, Action Aid, LEAD, LGDA, CAFOD, AfriCare, CTDO, ADRA, MDTC, Plan International and WeEffect.

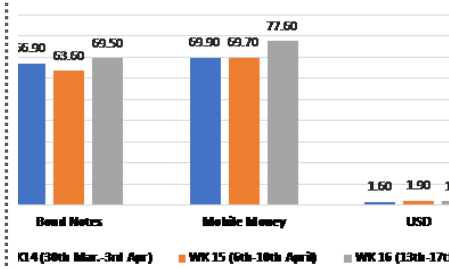


## Cooking Oil - Availability and Prices

Cooking oil was available in all the monitored markets. There was a slight increase in week on week availability of the commodity in 86.5% of the markets compared to 85% reported last week.

### Urban Domains

Figure 6: Cooking oil week on week price



◆ The week on week availability of the commodity improved by 20% compared to 70% reported last week. This is likely a result of improved supply of the commodity by the manufacturers and stagnant demand mainly as a result of the lockdown.

◆ Current prices of ZWL69.50/L for bond note payments and ZWL77.60/L for mobile money payments are 9% and 11% higher than those recorded in the last reporting period.

◆ Prices in USD reduced slightly by an average of USD 0.20/L. These price variations in USD prices which is a relatively stable currency are attributable to market adjustments due to legalisation of forex payments. (See annex 12)

### Rural Districts

◆ The week on week availability of cooking oil in rural areas remained unchanged at 86%. About 58% of the interviewed traders were accepting USD although mobile money remains the main method of payment.

◆ Prices in both bond notes and mobile money increased, going up on average by 8% and 17% respectively. (See annex 11)

## Approach

**Checking Availability at market level:** If any of the interviewed traders in a market reports having sold a commodity within the last week, the commodity is considered available in this market. Availability at country-level (district-level) is calculated as the share of markets with commodity availability across the country (across districts). Missing data indicate that none of the interviewed traders generally trades the commodity.

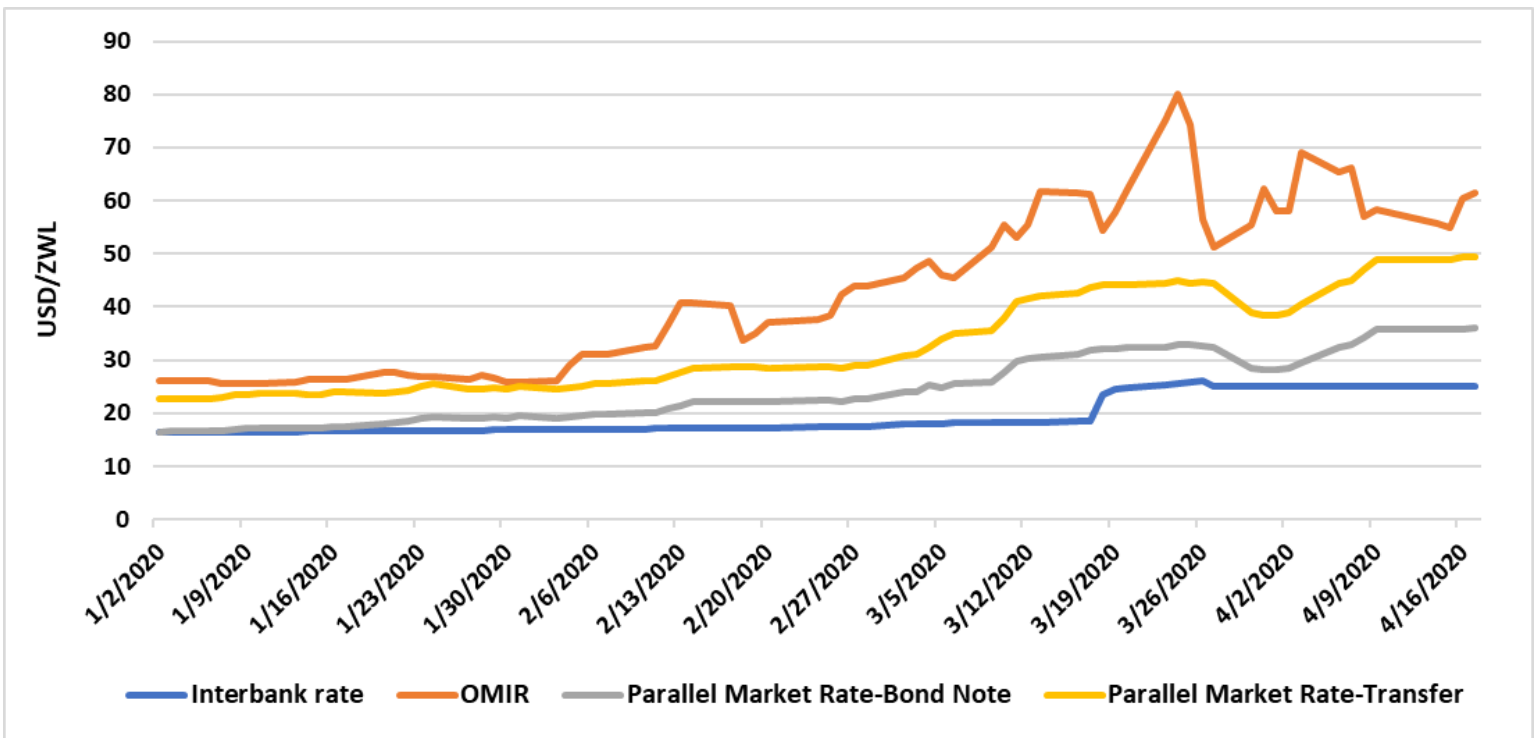
