3.	Partners that have provided the response <i>(including the response to the newly displaced families)</i> are kindly requested to report their achievements using the standard reporting mechanism.	Standing Action Point
4.	Partners are kindly requested to share the FSAC village-level mapping before finalization of plans, the mapping should also be updated by the <b>5<sup>th</sup> of every month</b> as agreed <i>[once there is any change on the shared information]</i> .	Standing Action Point

6.	Affected partners are kindly requested to share the relevant information related to the impact of fuel shortage on ongoing interventions	Ongoing

## **3) New IDPs updates**

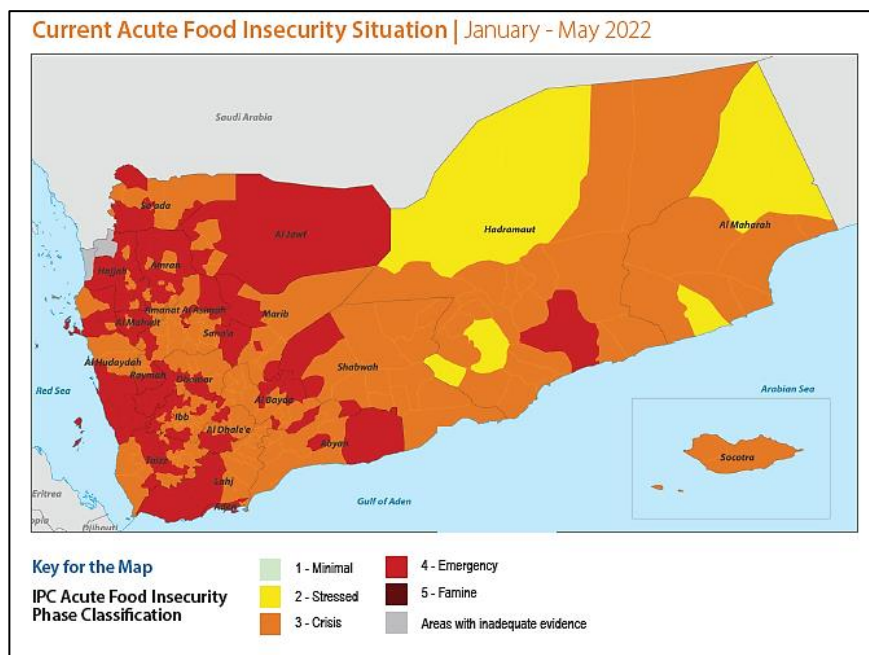
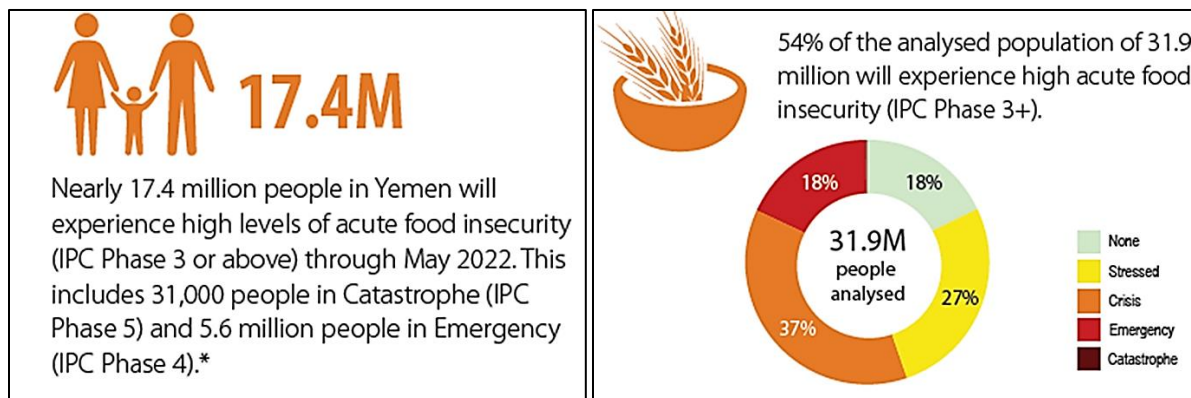
- OCHA reported 53 IDP families trapped in Maqbanah, Akhdu Asfal sub-district
  - The assessment report along with the list was shared with FSAC active partners in Maqbanah for verification;
  - Verification results: 18 HHs are found in the regular distribution list, 35 are not
  - Partners who have the capacity to respond are highly encouraged to approach FSAC as soon as possible;
  - There is an urgent need to support these household after rapidly assessing the food needs as per FSAC standards

- New IDPs updates as communicated by RRM are as follows:

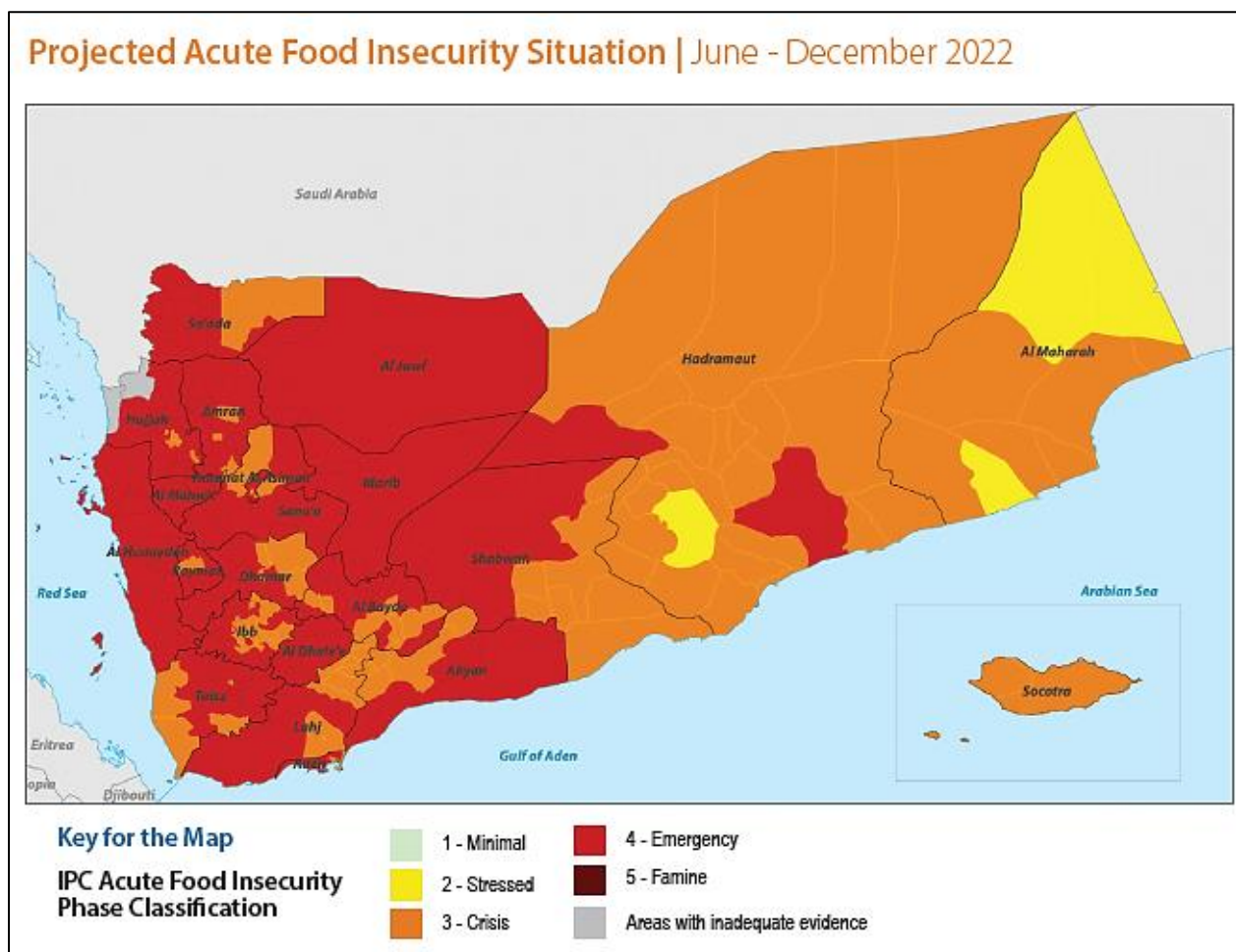
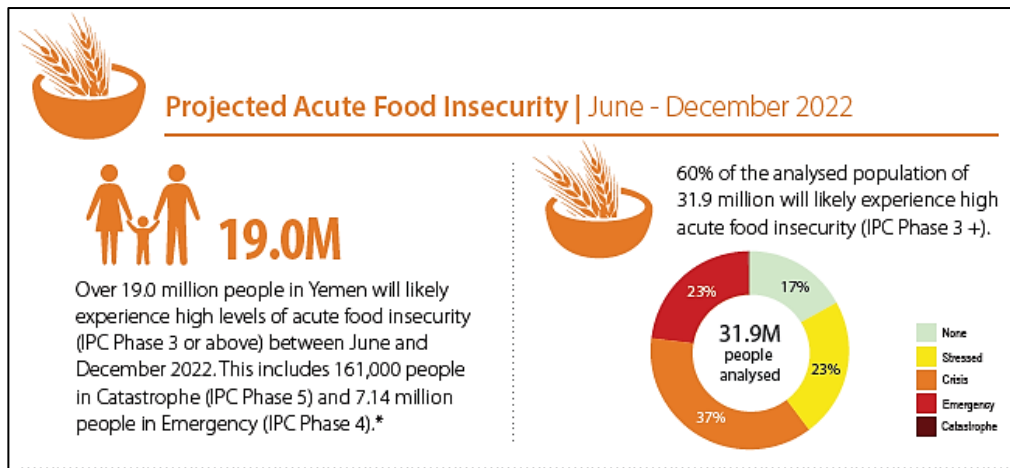

#### **6) Flood preparedness & fuel shortages impact**

- Flood preparedness:
  - Multiple reports and the seasonal calendar indicate that floods are expected during April-May,
  - Partners are highly encouraged to report any flood affected people
  - Partners are also encouraged to prepare for any needed support; including mobilization of emergency food assistance immediately to the affected families
  - Any partner has an emergency stock that can be mobilized to support flood-affected people should immediately coordinate with FSAC for preparedness
- Fuel shortage impact:
  - As requested by OCHA, partners are kindly requested to share updates pertaining to fuel shortages impact on humanitarian operations and activities using the standard template
  - This will enable further information sharing and advocacy efforts at the national level
  - The template have been shared multiple times with all FSAC partners with Hub by email
