2- IDPs Response- Updates and Gaps:

There are still gap for the newly IDPs starting from January up to 28th of June 2022 in Al-Hudaydah- Raymah and AL-Mahwit Governorates. In a cumulative figures in the three governorates Almost registered 5,302 HHs in Al-Hudaydah, out of this 193 HHs are in WFP list, 4,135 received RRM kit. Main reasons for displacements are conflict with 5,233 HHs and only 11 due to flood. In AL-Mahwit only 27 HHs registered and 5 out of them are used to received GFD from WFP. Main reasons for displacements are conflict with 19 HHs and only 8 due to flood. In Raymah only 31 HHs registered as new IDPs no one of them in WFP GFD lists. Main reasons for displacements are conflict with 31 HHs. The below graph show the cumulative list report for the RRM January to June 28th 2022.

Action point :

- ✓ IDPs with no single support are considered for new projects.
- ✓ FSAC partners continue their advocacy and mobilize resources needs with respective donors to cover minimum needs in food security and lifesaving activities.
- ✓ FSAC to share the updated gap matrix for the hub





a- Emergency Food Assistance:

Hudaydah:

In May, 1,629,102 individuals have been assisted with monthly emergency food assistance within 25 districts of Hudaydah. This is



implemented by 10 active FSAC partners provided emergency food assistance in May 2022. The key active partners implementing EFA in May are WFP, IRY,VHI, DRC, NFDHR, SFHRP BFD, and None WFP are (CARE-NRC- SCI and LMMPO).


AL-Mahwit: In May, 363,263 individuals have been assisted with monthly emergency food assistance within 9 districts of AL-Mahwit. This is implemented by 4 active FSAC partners provided emergency food assistance 2022. The key active partners implementing EFA are **WFP**, **YFCA**, **SFHRP**, **(CARE internal funds)**.

Raymah: In May, 173,348 individuals have been assisted with monthly emergency food assistance within 6 districts of Raymah. This is implemented by 2 active FSAC partners provided emergency food assistance 2022. 119. The key active partners implementing EFA are **WFP**, **IRY and RI**.

b. Livelihoods Assistance: For the livelihoods assistance, in May 2022:



Hudaydah:

In May, 23,598 individuals have been assisted with emergency livelihoods assistance, 13,862 individuals supported with CFW and 4,020 individuals with livelihoods assets restoration support, As of May, 41,480 individuals with ELA and livelihoods asset restoration assistance. As accumulative from JAN to May 69,743 individuals reached with livelihoods. Key FSAC partners are –FAO/SRA, FAO/MOZN, UNDP/SMEPS, IRY, NFDHR, BFD, and UNDP/SFD.

AL-Mahwit: In May, 10,284 individuals have been assisted with CFW assistance and 315 with livelihoods restoration. As of May, 39,294 individuals have been supported with livelihoods and CFW assistance accumulative from JAN to May 2022. Three partners only were involved in implementing livelihoods assistance; are UNDP, SFD and CARE. In AL-Mahwit, 5 districts Ar Rujum- At Tawilah- AL-Mahwit- Milhan and Bani Sa`ad districts,

Raymah: In May, 14,175 individuals have been assisted with CFW assistance . As of May, 25,767 individuals have been supported with CFW assistance accumulative from JAN to May 2022. Key active partner involved in implementing livelihoods assistance are UNDP/SFD.

4. AOB:

Natural disasters preparedness plans:

The discussion is focused on the response to affected families in onset emergency context like flooding. The rainy season start in near by mountainous districts that a clear alert for a good preparation.

- ✓ Consider the main steps in response the flood affecting e.g. Assessment- Verification cross check process and immediately timely response.
