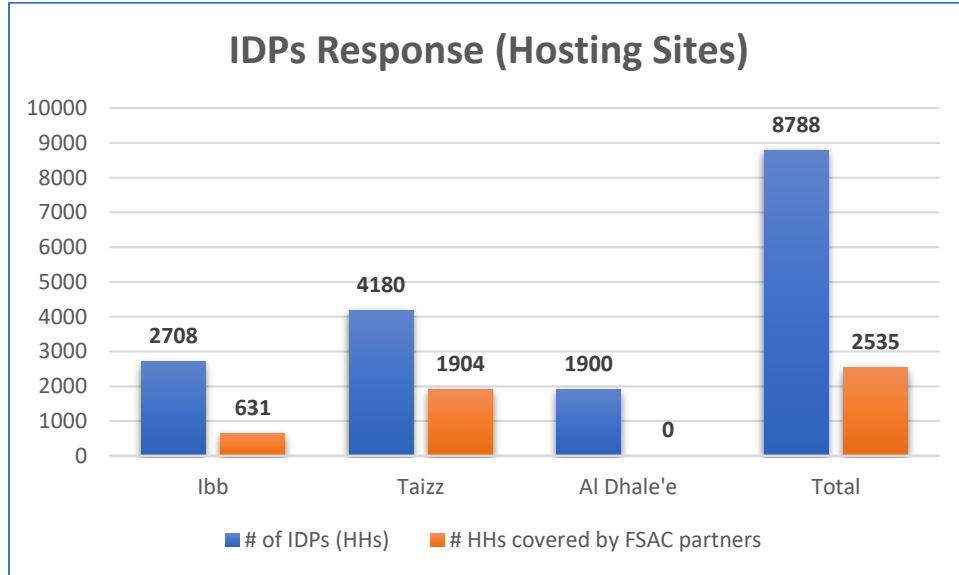
A. IDPs in hosting sites

- As shown below, the table shows the response gaps per district for all districts in Ibb, Taizz and Al Dhale'e governorates and under Ibb AoR:

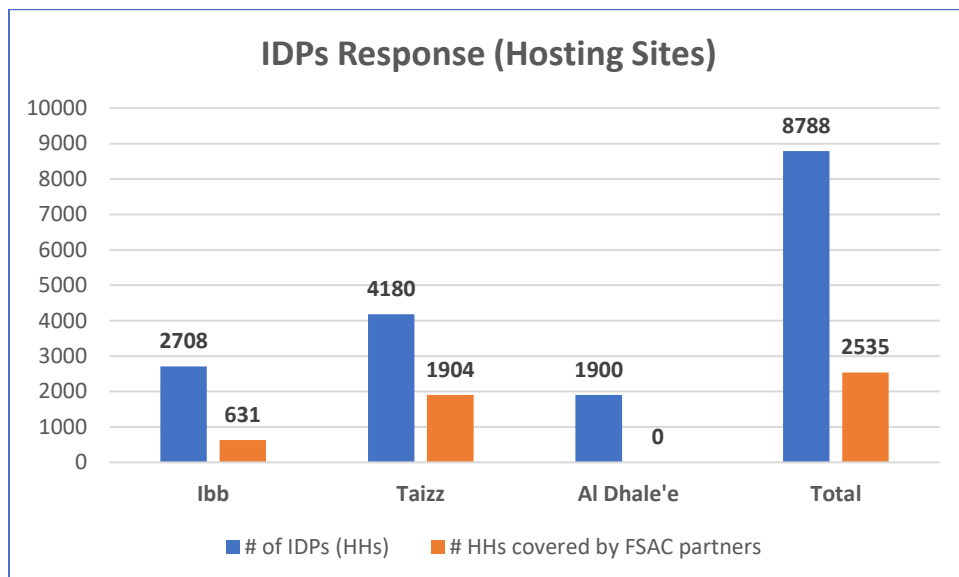

 - Al Dhale'e, Qa'atabah

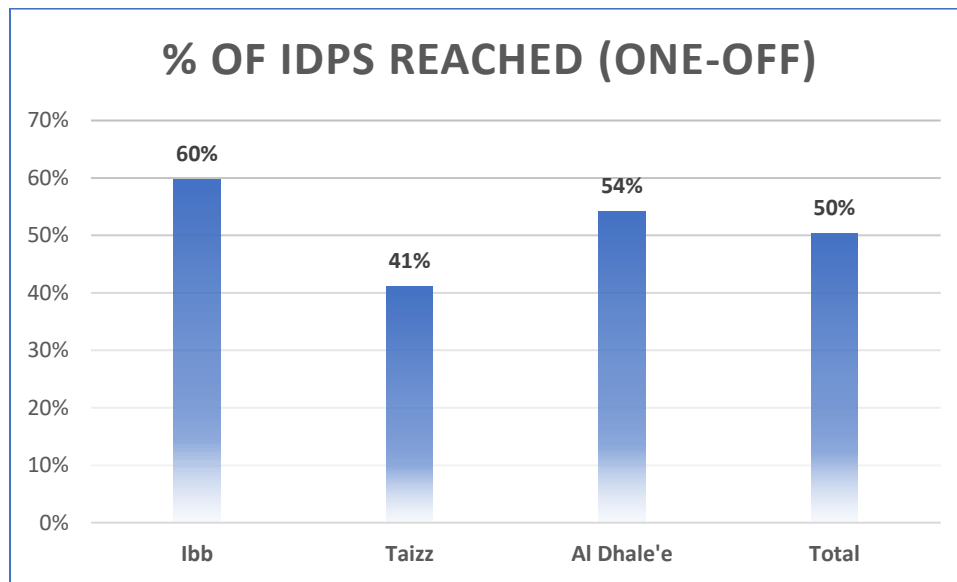

- This needs further verification and resource mobilization by partners
- Needs assessment needs to be coordinated the soonest

4. Livelihoods Zones – Minimum Livelihood Package Review

- SNCC briefed partners about the objective of this exercise as well as the progress as follows:
 - Preparing the templates and tools – Done - Jun -W1
 - Coordination with authorities and technical line ministries (gov. level) – Done – Jun – W1,2&3
 - Review the composition, the quantities, and the prices – Now (ongoing)
 - Assign a technical working group from FSAC partners to review inputs received as follows:
 - Active partners + leading agencies
 - Partners with experience in livelihoods implementation
 - Technical persons to be nominated
 - Any other interested partner with the requisite capacity
- TWG to meet immediately after the drafting of the revised MLP by authorities (July-W1)
- TWG to share the final draft by July W1
- Final draft to be shared with all partners for any final comments before endorsement
