




 28 partners reportedly reached about 2.4 million people with food and livelihood assistance across the country during reporting period of 6 – 19 September.




Food Assistance: people reached




UKRAINE FOOD SECURITY & LIVELIHOODS CLUSTER



Operational updates

- Food Assistance finally shifted to the frontline of the conflict.
- Food assistance increased for Sumska oblast, but rapidly reduced value in all other non-frontline regions.
- WCK reduced their activities based on recent reporting, which will cause the gap in their operation locations.
- People from liberated areas (such as Izum) already started relocation for winter. Similar relocations are mandatory for people in Donetska oblast, and recommended for people in Zaporizska oblast. Locations for the relocation is Cherkaska and Kirovohradska oblast, where the gap for partner's presence.

Severity Ranking

Remote CARI

The food security situation of the most food insecure 25% of the population is used to classify each area.

rCARI approach has 4 severity levels, and 5th is corresponds to famine.

Severity Ranking of each region has been defined as the rCARI severity level with more than 25% of population (combined with previous levels from highest to lowest)




