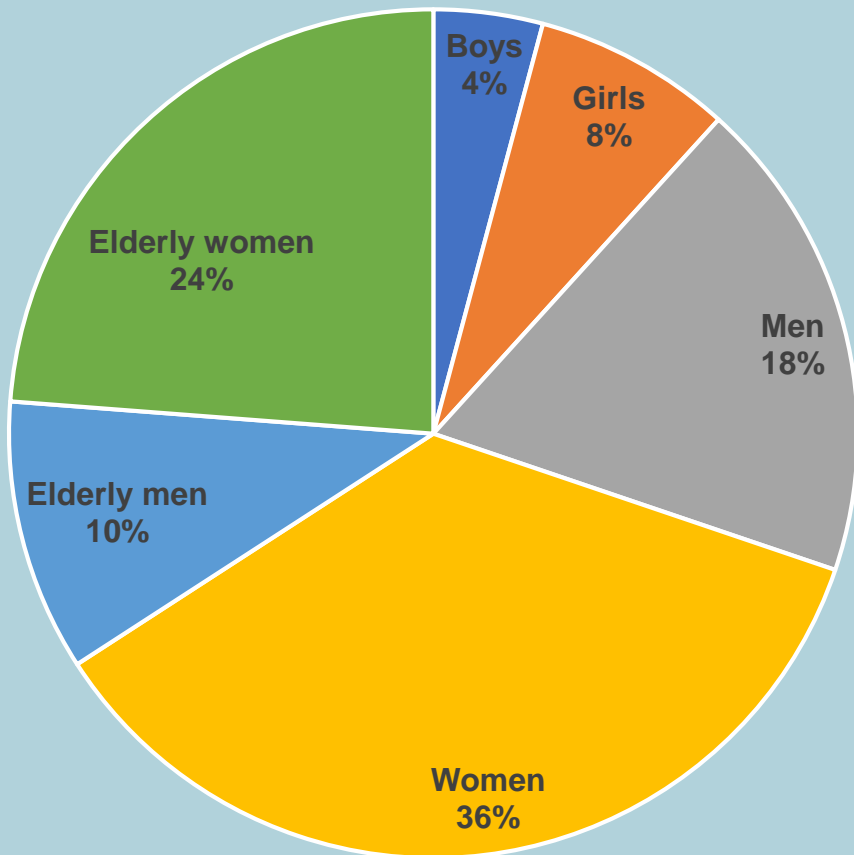

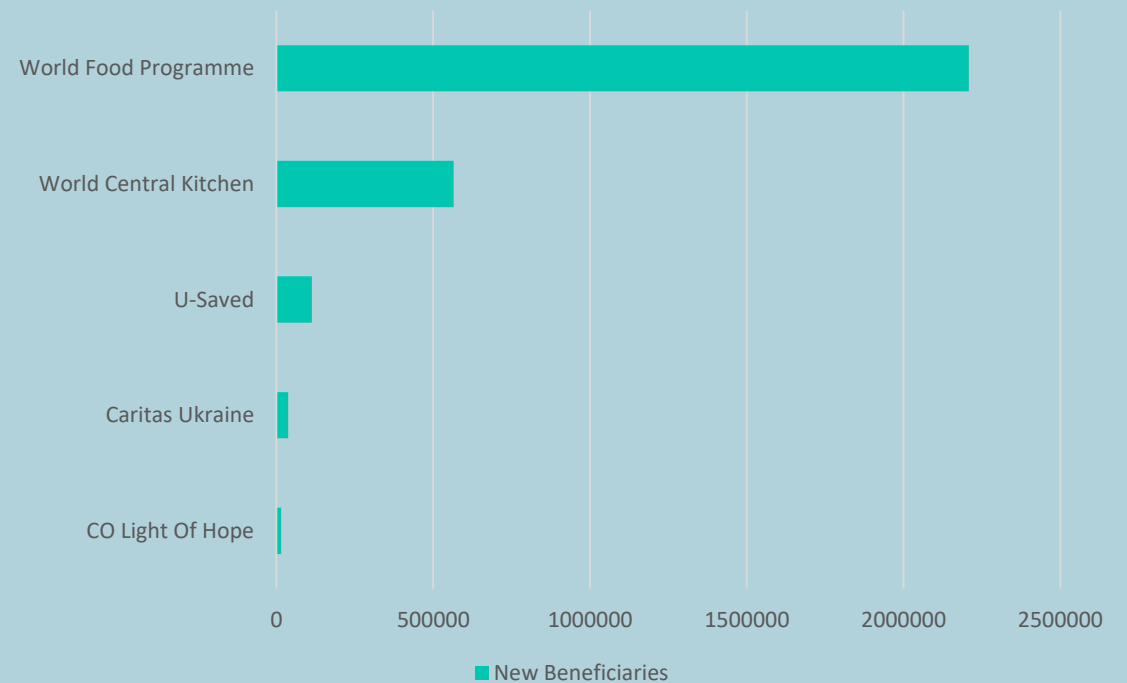
# FSLC operational updates (January 2023)

Top 5 Reporting partners, January 2023



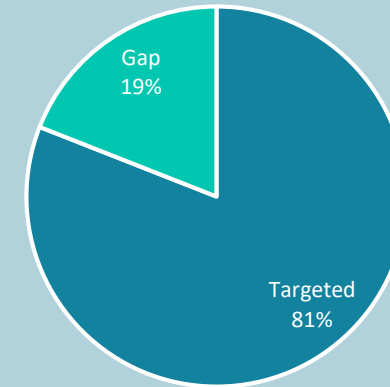

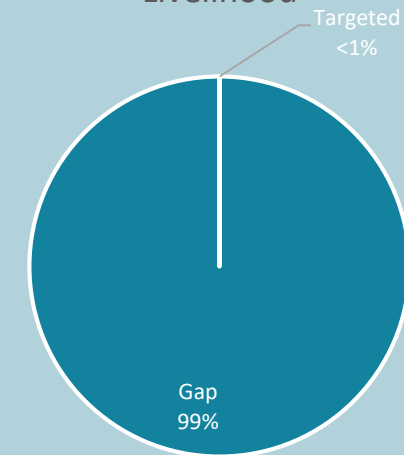

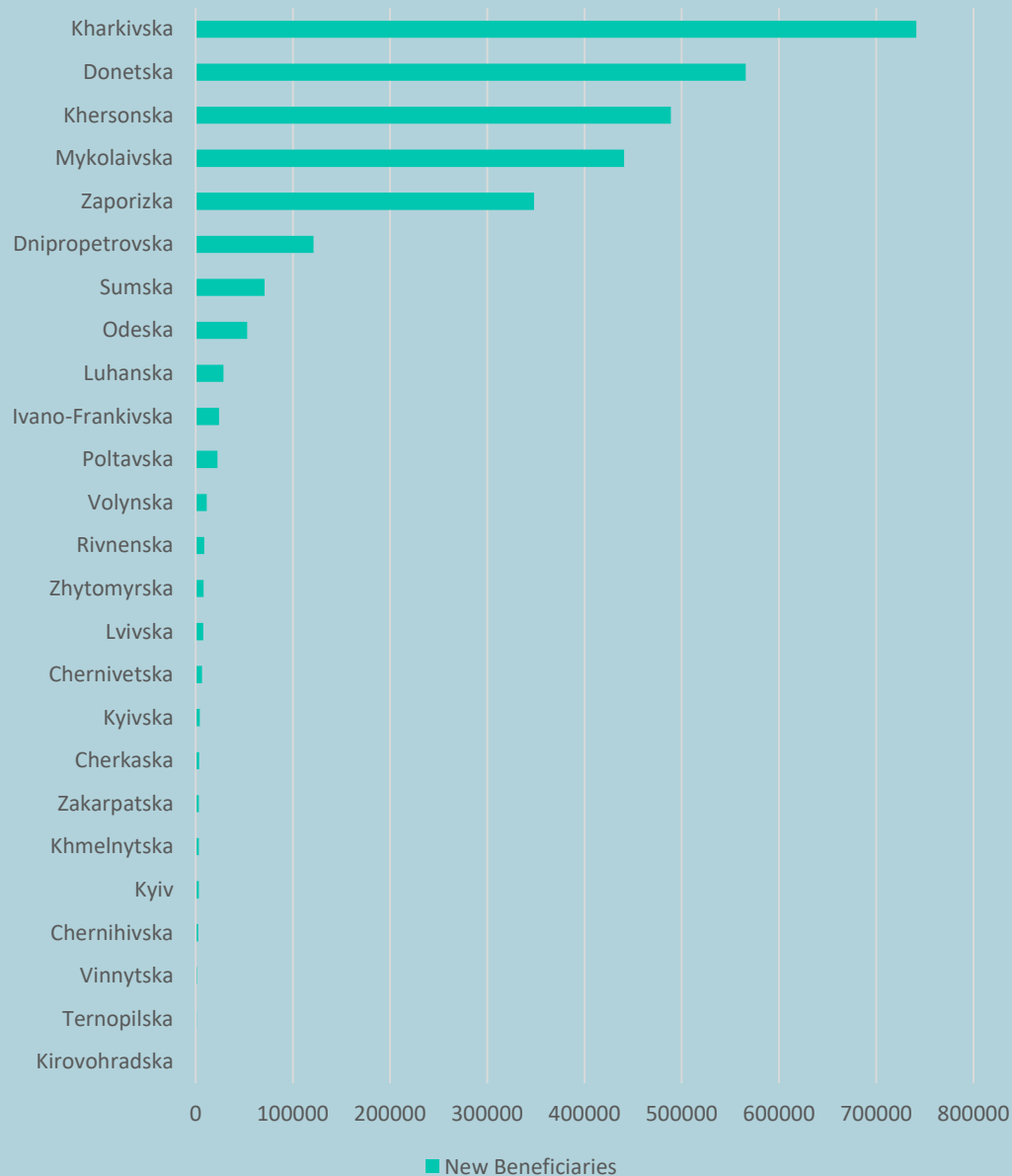
