GFD Round 12 & 13

- Round 12: Distribution started 19th - 29th March, WFP and 6 NGOs.
- Round 12 planned to distribute among 107,839 HHs and reached 104,645 HHs (**470,902** individuals approximately)
- Round 13: Started on 03rd April and will run till 16th April and plan to distribute to 150,189 HHs and as of 08th April 71,002 HHs has reached.
- e-Vouchers: 200,000 people enrolled in shops

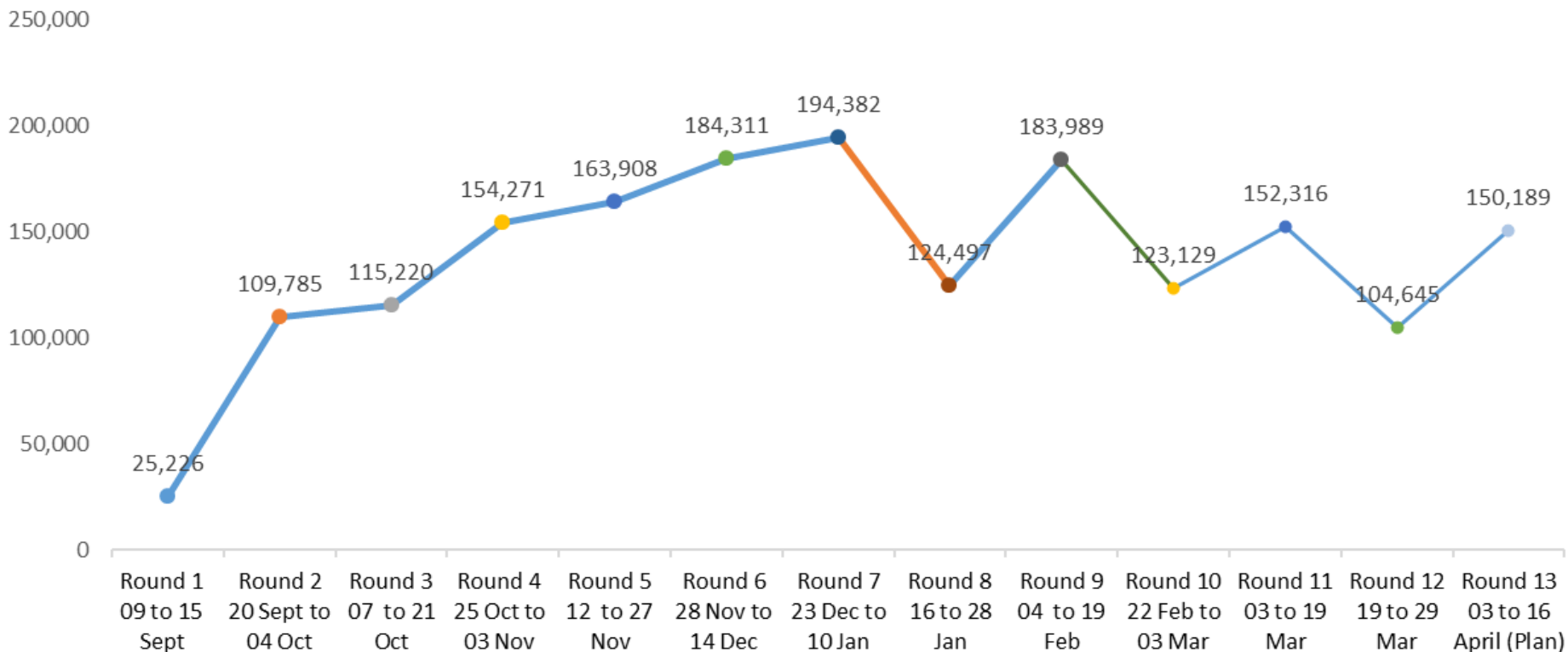

Round 1 to 13 GFD HHs Reached



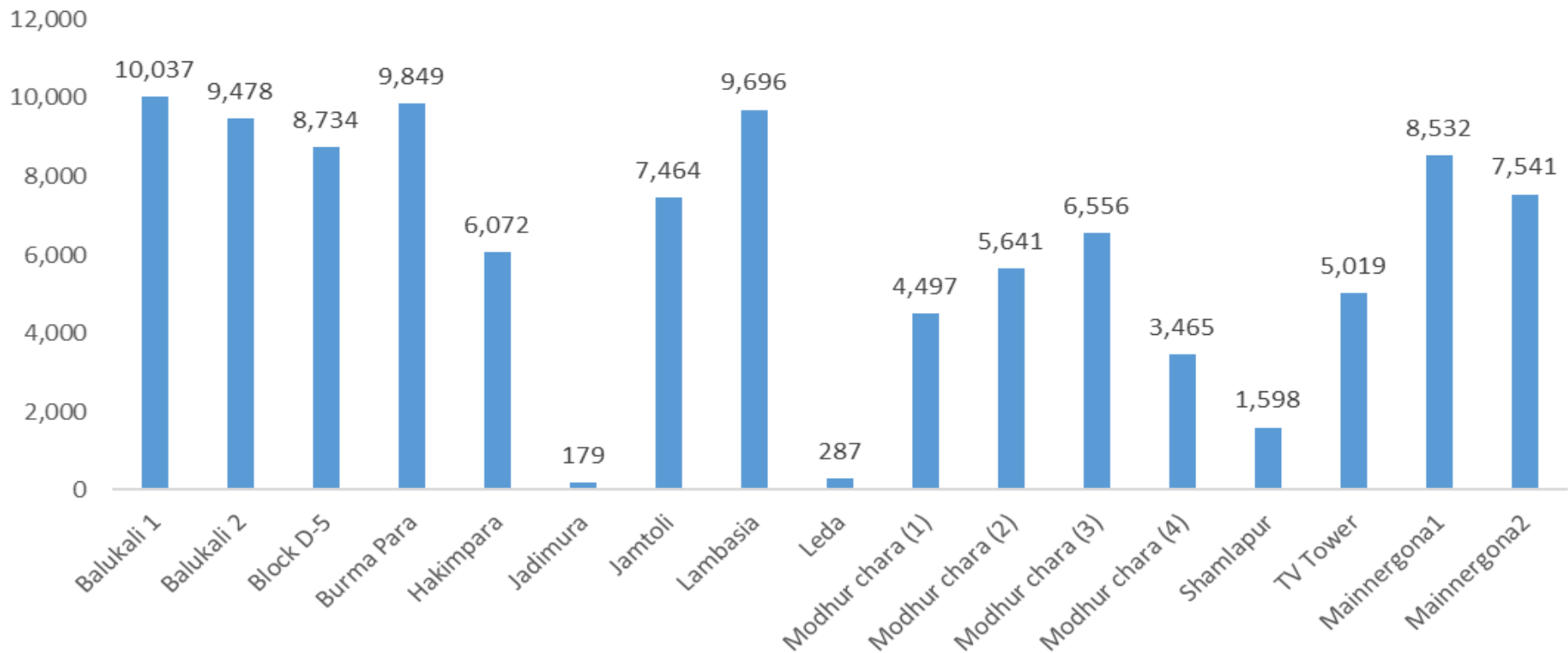
N.B.: The reduction in numbers of HHs at Rounds 8 & 10 is explained by the exclusion of size 1-3 HHs, while for Round 11, the reduction is explained by the use of new biometric system for counting HHs which have significantly reduced the duplication



GFD Round 12 by Location

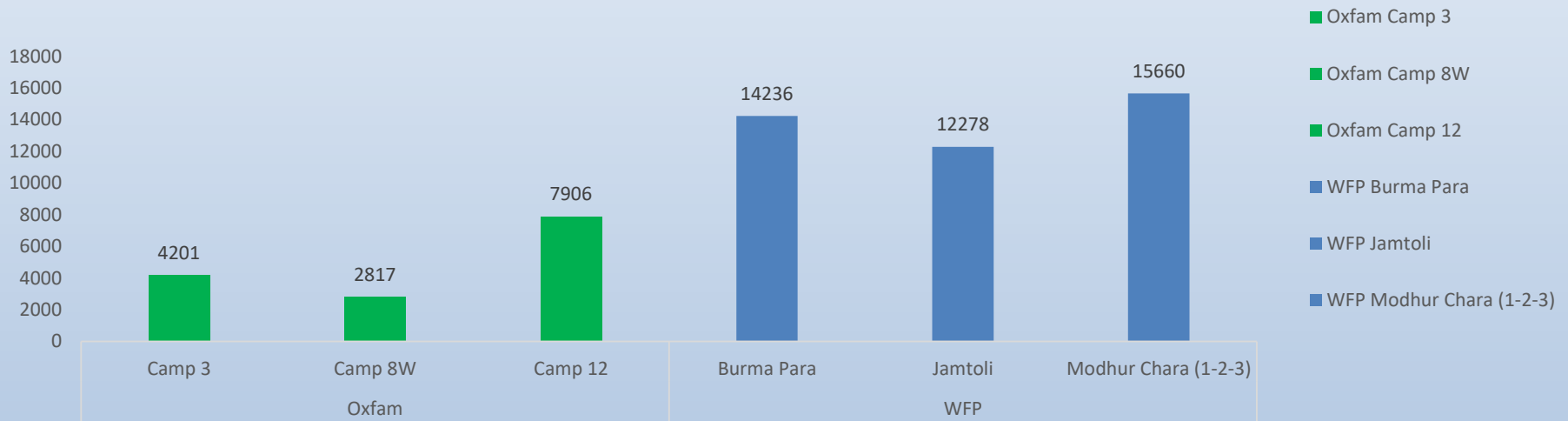

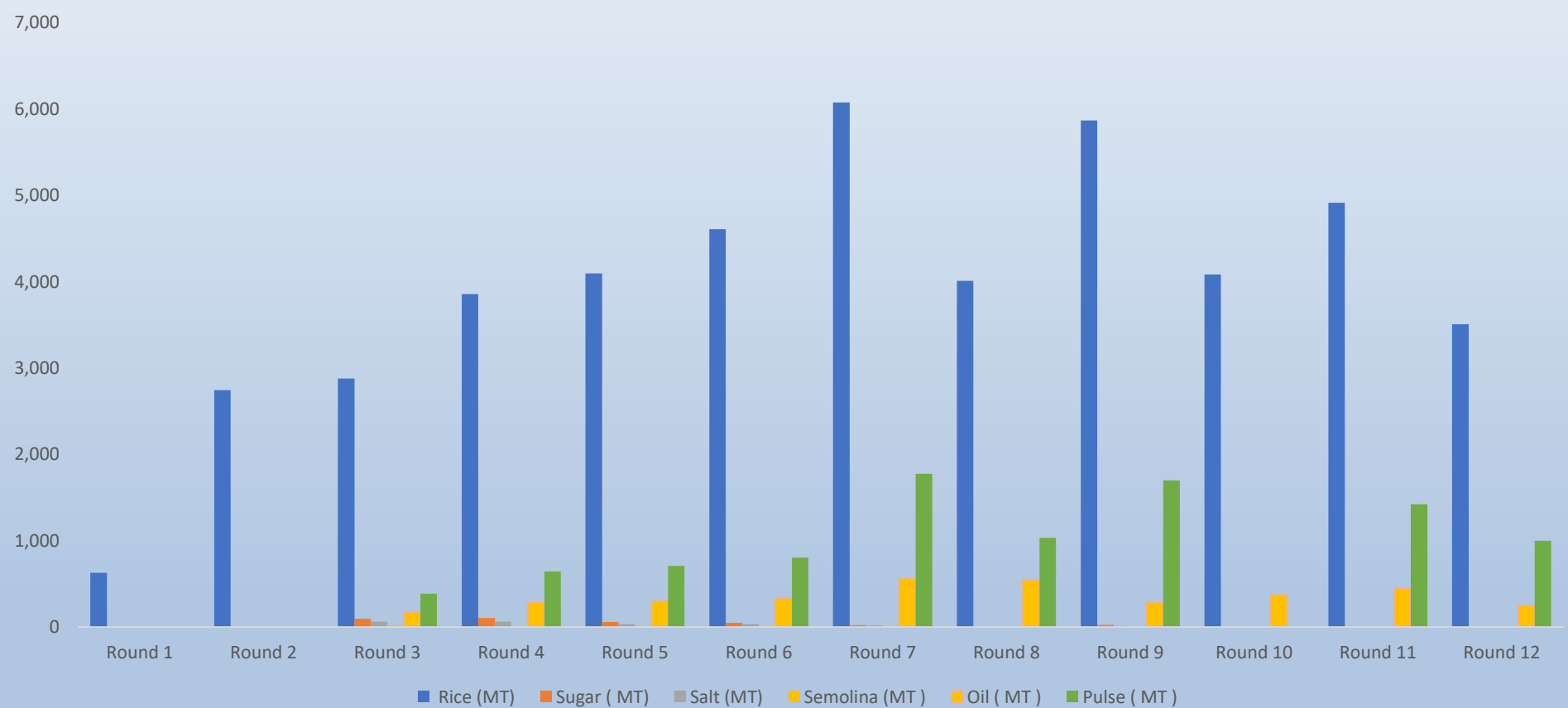

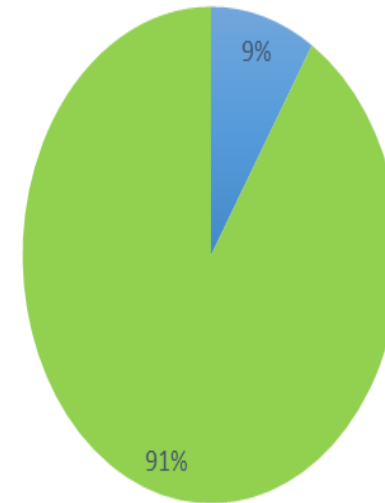

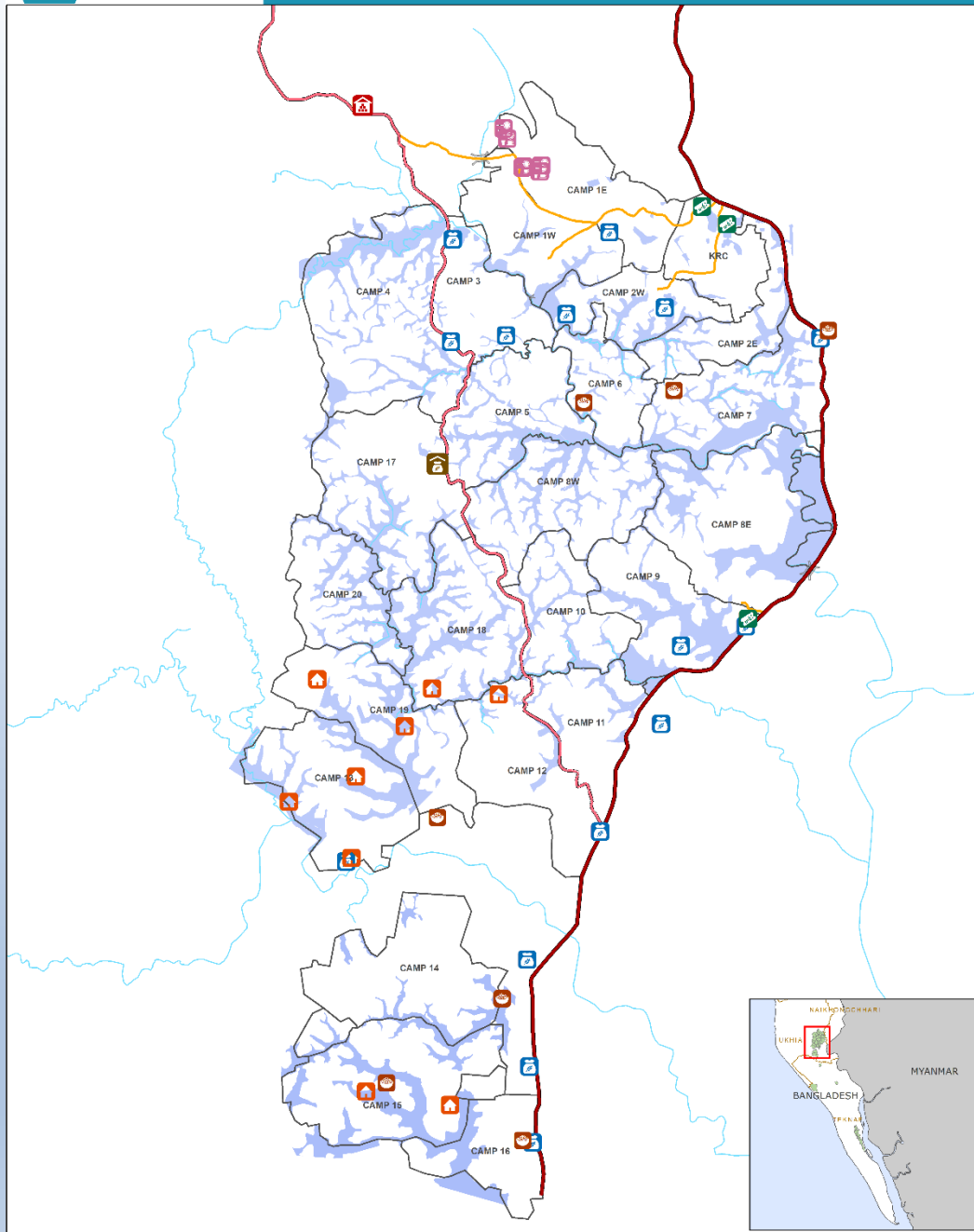
