WFP's Geospatial Support Unit Internal deployment of ADAM Floods system			
	ADAM (Automated Disaster Analysis and Mapping) is a corporate system maintained by the		
	Geospatial Support Unit to provide geospatial services to WFP and the larger humanitarian community.		
	ADAM Tropical Storm and Earthquake have been operational since 2012 and 2014 and have		
	since delivered analysis and visualization during the first critical 72 hours of a disaster.		
м	Floods will cover the three phases of flood disaster timeline		
	The design of ADAM Floods products is built on the nature of the flooding disaster to provide		
	information at each phase. In cooperation with the Analysis and Early Warning Unit (AEW),		
	ADAM Floods will deliver a flood alert map (dashboard) with 3-5 days lead time for very large		
	river basins. A flood monitoring system can be activated on demand to produce a weekly flood		
	summary from coarse resolution satellite-based information with daily global coverage.
