2. FSAC Partners’ updates on IDPs Response and Gaps EFA and Livelihoods

A. Response in both EFA and Livelihoods in Al-Hudaydah- AL-Mahwit and Raymah:

- **FSAC Partners FFA and Livelihoods:**
- **Emergency Food Assistance:**
 - In March 2022, total of 1,221,136 individuals have been supported with emergency food assistance in 25 districts of Hudaydah.
 - In March 2022, total of 292,463 individuals have been supported with emergency food assistance in 8 districts of AL-Mahwit.
 - In March 2022, total of 109,851 individuals have been supported with emergency food assistance in 5 districts of Raymah.
- **Livelihoods and Cash For Work:**
 - For Livelihoods and CFW, 6,104 individuals have been assisted with conditional cash transfer in Hudaydah during March. The total number of assisted individuals since January is 19,810 individuals.
 - For Livelihoods and CFW, 8,358 individuals have been assisted with conditional cash transfer in AL-Mahwit during March. The total number of assisted individuals since January is 19,377 individuals.
 - For Livelihoods and CFW, 2,639 individuals have been assisted with conditional cash transfer in Raymah during March. The total number of assisted individuals since January is 23,884 individuals.

- Stabilization of local food production, increased food availability and access, increased self-reliance, and support for investments in Yemenis' resilience will be among the top priorities.

4. FSAC Targets 2022 in Hudaydah-AL-Mahwit and Raymah;

By May 2022, FSAC produced the new FSAC target. Around 19 M people are in need for assistance. Out of this 17.4 M will be targeted by FSAC support.

A- For Hudaydah FSAC target 2022:

- Number of individuals targeted through emergency food assistance (in kind, cash or voucher transfers) on a monthly basis is 1,978,600 individuals (see the attached for the breakdown on district level).
- Number of individuals targeted through emergency agricultural, livestock, and fisheries kits is 209,175 individuals. (see the attached for the breakdown on district level).
- Number of individuals targeted through conditional, season specific cash transfer to rehabilitate community assets, and infrastructure is 278,900 individuals. (see the attached for the breakdown on district level).
- Number of individuals targeted through livelihoods assets restoration support, assistance in establishing micro-businesses, and skills in enhancing employability is 69,725 individuals. (see the attached for the breakdown on district level).

5. AOB:

- On April 17th, 2022, the FSAC MFB Technical Working Group (TWG) recommended a revised value for the FSAC MFB, which was approved at the national cluster partners meeting on April 28th, 2022.
- The MFB transfer values are based on a rigorous analysis and assessment of food commodity price data from January to March 2022 (pegged on averages of WFP and FAO market data), as well as a food basket composition that fulfills 80-85 percent Kcal for a household size of 7.
- The following are the two techniques that were endorsed:

(a) Harmonized transfer value based on average household size of 7

The FSAC MFB will have a harmonized transfer value of YER 65 000/ household/month in the northern governorates and YER 122, 500 /Household/month of 7 persons.

In the northern governorates, this equates to USD 109 per home per month whereas in southern governorates, it equates to USD 106 per household per month.

(b) Differentiate food basket based on actual household size

Some FSAC partners can change transfer values based on the actual number of eligible household members for operational reasons. For households with 1-10 individuals, this would equal to the following transfer values:

- ✓ The revised FSAC MFB will come into effect on 01st May 2022 and will remain valid until the Next update.

Action Point: FSAC partners in Al-Hudaydah- AL-Mahwit and Raymah implementing emergency food assistance including cash and voucher modalities should adhere to the new transfer value, which is YER 65,000/HH/Month.
