1. Review of last Meeting Action Points

- FSAC to facilitate the hand-over process for IDPs whom YFCA has been supporting, to Gift Directly.
Ongoing: FSAC linked Give Directly by YFCA to exchange all relevant data. Notable; the data of IDPs should be shared by IDPs EXu.
- CARE to share information about its intervention in Al Buriqah and Dar Sa'ad districts, Aden.
Partially Done: CARE shared tentative information about its intervention in the above-mentioned districts. However, the registration is still ongoing and last details will be shared once registration is finalized.
- Acted (CCY partner) to update FSAC about its intervention in Al Dhale'e.
Partially Done: Acted plans to target some IDPs sites in Al Dhale'e and Qatabah districts and host communities in Al-Azareq district. In addition, Acted plans to target new arrivals reported by RRM data.
- FSAC to refer any remain gap in the sites of Al Dhale'e to GC.
Done: last update, the remained gap will be referred to Acted.
- FSAC Partners to share with FSAC, any information/assessment about the areas reported with gap in Lahj.
Done.
- FSAC to hold meeting with partners intervening in Qatabah district, to discuss coordination related subjects there.
Done: FSAC convened meeting involving all partners implementing emergency food assistance/MPCA response in concerned districts.
- FSAC to support partners who are looking for refugees information, through link them with relevant cluster.

Done: FSAC shared contact details of RMMS cluster with pertinent partners.

2. IDPs responses, updates and gaps

- FSAC presented the gap at IDPs site in Aden, Lahj Al Dhale'e and Abyan governorates as per the table below:

- ADRA is embarking the implementation of new project in Lahj, Abyan and Al Dhale'e, targeting around 8350 HHs for six cycles of emergency food assistance distribution. The districts per each governorate are as follows; Abyan (Zinjibar and Khanfar), Lahj (Radfan, Habil Gabr, Al Madaribah, Halymein, Al Melah and Tuban) and Al Dhale'e (Al Dhale'e City , Al Shu'eeb and Al Husyen). ADRA is interested to designate this response to cover flagged gap among IDPs sites in the targeting districts. FSAC is going to share the detailed gap with ADRA.
- HRF completed last cycle of emergency food assistance distribution in Al Dhale'e district targeting IDPs and host communities in coordination with IDPs EXu, CCCM and FSAC.
- CARE plants to target Al Qaloa'h and Bier Ahmed areas in Al Buriqah district, based on coordination with IDPs EXu and FSAC. The two IDPs sites (Al Hofrah and Al Farsi), which left by Wedyan un-covered, are deemed as priority. The discussion with Give Directly is ongoing to explore potentiality of including aforementioned sites within its intervention.
- FSAC was asked by MoPIC, IDPs EXu and CCCM about the timeline of WFP cash assistance distribution in Aden. The tentative plan of WFP is to resume cash assistance distribution in Aden by 2nd week of July.

- Give Directly is currently interacting with YFCA to proceed with hand-over process as well as coordinating with IDPs EXu. The plan is to commence 1st cycle of MPCA distribution in August, Insha Allah.

Action points

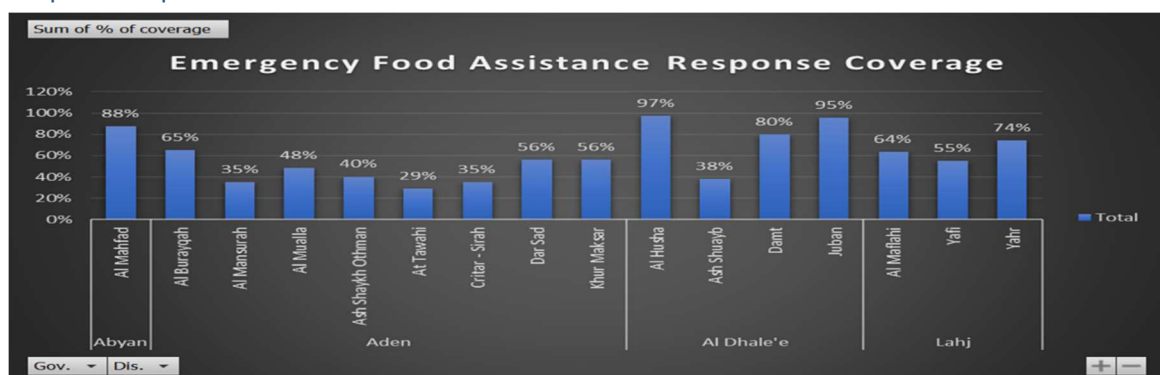
- ADRA to share initial details related to its new intervention in Lahj, Abyan and Al-Dhale'e governorates and FSAC to send details of gap for possibility of covering the gap by ADRA intervention.
- WFP to keep FSAC updated about the timeline of distribution.
- FSAC and Give Directly to confirm the status of Al Hodar and Al Farsi IDPs collective sites in terms of gaps and response.

3. Presentation on the updated FSAC interactive dashboard

- FSAC IM team made a presentation on the updated FSAC interactive dashboard.
- FSAC producing response products on a monthly basis to reflect FSAC partners achievements/response
- Navigation of the Interactive Response Dashboards 2022:
 - Partner Presence Map: displays FSAC partners active in the different locations during any selected month.
 - Monthly Response Dashboard: displays FSAC partners' responses and beneficiaries assisted during any selected month.
 - Unique Beneficiaries Dashboard: displays the unique beneficiary figures reached by FSAC partners since January 2022.
 - Gap Analysis Dashboard: displays the geographic gaps in targeting populations under HRP 2022 for activities under FSAC SO1 and SO2.

4. Regular response updates (achievements, gaps, and challenges)+ one off distribution

- FSAC highlighted the districts with coverage less than 100% under emergency food assistance response as per the chart below



- The gap analysis was made based on the last target number of HRP for 2022 Vs number of assisted people in April 2022.
- FSAC listed the partners who reported through FSAC Mapping in 2022 and thus, this mapping will be adopted to guide cluster and partners to coordinate any planned intervention and avoid overlapping. FSAC requested other partners to submit their mapping inputs by 21 July 2022. So far, the partners reported through the mapping are as follows; WFP, FAO, UNDP, Afaq Shababia Foundation, NMO, CARE International, Relief International, FMF, SCI, Global Communities, SMEPS, Helpcode Italia Onlus, SI, Horizon Foundation for Development (HFD), HRF, Muslim Hands, YFCA, NRC, SHS, Oxfam, HDP, YDN.
- Some partners plan to distribute meat at Eid Al Adha and thus, to avoid any duplication in assisted people, they are going to coordinate with each other ahead the activity implementation. So far, HRF, Yemen Aid, Muslim Hands and HFD are going to undertake this activity this month.
- FSAC presented the outputs of the ad-hoc coordination meeting held for partners implementing EFA response in Al Dhale'e. The table below outlines the key-points related to targeting areas of each partner:
