This information should be extended to bidders.

FAO is encouraged to provide regular updates to the Food security sector on livestock activities and intervention across the BAY states. Discussions went around CRS's off-takers program: Emphasis should be laid on copping strategy. Hatchery unit by Borno state government to be made accessible to the public. Breed of livestock distributed to beneficiaries by CRS is Local Fulani breed The CRS livestock project provides 6KG of Vital feeds to beneficiaries.
