3	Presentation on Fuel Efficient Stoves PDM-Midterm Evaluation by FAO.  The Evaluation showed a reduction in firewood collection frequency that reduces exposure especially for women and girls  It also showed a significant reduction in Household's firewood consumption by 58% and 51% reduction in weekly expenditure on firewood.	



Unquantifiable benefits - decrease in exposure to smoke which causes eye irritation, coughing and other allergies; reduced degradation to the environment.

## Q&A

1. How were the types of stoves used chosen? Are they what is available on the local market or was there an assessment done to understand the most appropriate type of stove?

Ans. An assessment was carried out within the North east and the stove was tested in the lab before use.

- 2. ICEED is working to modify the FES to accommodate a bigger pot up to 30 liters.
- **3.** What is the sustainability of using this FES considering that fuel and wood is readily not available in most communities?

Ans. The stove is compatible with briquettes and can be used even without woods.

- **4.** Can we have an upgraded version of the FES going forward? Ans. FOA welcomes recommendations on upgraded Versions of FES that have been tested in the Lab and ascertained that it is compatible with the global alliance on energy.
- 5. How can beneficiaries access the materials they may need to fix their damaged FES themselves?

Ans. Clay is available in most places and the recommendation is to train beneficiaries on minor repairs such as fixing a minor crack on their FES.

- **6.** Is there any plan by FOA to explore any other cooking energy besides FES?
  - Ans. Yes, they are searching for a sustainable clean cooking energy that has been globally tested and approved to adopt.
