In his speech, he expressed his displeasure on the attendance, however, encourage partners to take the meeting more serious.• Proceeding opening remarks, the chairperson called for a round table introduction of participants present at the meeting.	
3.0	Matters arising from the last meeting <ul style="list-style-type: none">• FSS LGA coordination should commence immediately• The secretary position was accepted by FAO (Mary), it was proposed that the government should provide an assistant secretary for sustainability and for capacity building. 4.0	<p>Outcome Analysis Result Presentation by Save the children</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Household Economic Approach (HEA) Outcome Analysis conducted in February 2021 was presented by SCI during the meeting. • The Outcome Analysis (OA) primarily investigates the effect of hazards, shock or other changes on current and future access to food and cash income at the Households (HHs) level. <p>Find the presentation here</p>

5.1	<p>FAO</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Supported 15480 HHS with improved seeds and fertilizer for 2021 rainy season intervention in eleven LGAs (Fune, Fika, Potiskum, Nangere, Geidam, Gulani, Gujba, Nguru, Karasuwa, Bade and Yunusari) of Yobe state. • Planned livestock restocking for goat and poultry. • 75 beneficiaries have been targeted, trained on integrated homestead (micro garden, aquaculture and drip irrigation) model in College of Agriculture. Monitoring is ongoing. • Plan to distribute fuel efficient stove (location have not been finalized). • Briquette production center constructed in Kukareta, Damaturu LGA, 50 women beneficiaries have been targeted, registered and trained. 	
5.2	<p>Save the Children</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • SCI under EU Resilience distributed farm inputs to 1,484 farmers in Damaturu 698(Furi, Ngabrawa, Mittiri, Kasaisa and Dikumari), Gujba 338 (College of Agric community, Garin Itace) and Potiskum 448 (Garin Maina, Garin Makwai, Lampade) via seed voucher. • SCI trained 330 farmers on seasonal weather pattern and environmental conservation in Damaturu, Gujba and Potiskum. 	



	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • SCI Constructed two fuel efficient stove production centers and trained 200 farmers on fuel efficient stove production in Damaturu 100 (Sumsumma) and Potiskum 100 (Adaya-Maje). 	
5.3	<p>Jireh Doo Foundation (JDF)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Supported 746 PLW and 3,456 children under the age of 5 with supplementary feeding (Action meal) in Dachia, Karage, Yim, Dagilwa, Zabu-dum, Gamsu, Girgir, Bayam and Kunu wards of Jakusko LGA as well as Kaigamari, Bulakari, Bulakulo, Zamburma, Karaukaku and Bamusu wards of Yusufari LGA. • Distributed 125g each of Tomato, Pepper, Spinach, Okro, Moringa and Roseelle seeds respectively to 200 households across the aforementioned wards in Jakusko and Yusufari LGAs. • Planned distribution of Livestock (poultry) to 200 Households 	
5.4	<p>JDPH</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Two months (July and August) distribution of nutritional supplements was done to under two children, pregnant and lactating women/girls in Fune LGA, a total of one thousand six hundred and three (1,603) beneficiaries were reached, while a total of one thousand seven hundred and eighty six (1,786) children reached. • General food distribution (GFD) was done for the month of July with a total of 21,187 beneficiaries reached. • JDPH/WFP plan on reaching more vulnerable persons in Fune LGA, to this effect a scale up of 23,856 persons will be giving food assistance in the month of August, while 99,569 persons reached in the month of September respectively. 	
5.5	<p>ICRC</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Conducted a multi-disciplinary assessment in 5 LGAs (Nguru, Bade, Karasuwa, Potiskum and Damaturu) of Yobe state. 	
5.6	<p>VSF</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Plan to distribute 3 sachets (50 grams each) of Geo Plus (NPK 24-10-10+TE) and 2 sachets (50 grams each) of Geo Urea (Urea 46-0-0+TE) and Knapsack sprayers (16 liters) to each of the benefiting 700 small holder farmers in Geidam LGA. 	



<p>5.7</p>	<p>DRC</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Completed the selection process for 500 youths who are going to receive business start-up grants • Supported farmer’s associations to continue to hold cooperative meetings. A total of 510 members of farmer groups were in the meeting, with 110 from Gujba LGA consisting six-nine (69) males and forty-one (41) females and from Gulani LGA, 400 representative attended, consisting 223 males and 177 females. • Step-down training for farmers facilitated by LGA extension workers and animal health workers in DRC’s BRICC LGAs of implementation. A total of 375 farmers were reached, with 224 from Gulani LGA consisting of 102 males and 122 females and from Gujba LGA, 151 farmers, consisting of 94 females and 62 males respectively. • ToT refresher training was conducted for 10 LGA extension staff and 10 community animal health workers • Supported weekly farmers’ radio phone-in program, Zauren Manoma on Yobe Broadcasting Corporation (YBC) 	
<p>5.8</p>	<p>AAH</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Millet first weeding, thinning and first manure application done in 13 demonstration farms. 551 out of 646 beneficiaries participated. • Cowpea seed sowing and second weeding/second manure application for millet. 477 out of 646 beneficiaries participated on 13 demonstration farms. • Group dynamics training for FFS beneficiaries. 551 out of 646 beneficiaries trained. • July Savings Meeting for year 2 beneficiaries, 322 beneficiaries across 21 groups attended. • Cash payment for year 2 cash for work beneficiaries, 121 beneficiaries out of 134 credited were paid. 	
<p>5.9</p>	<p>CCDRN</p> <p>Gulani LGA-UNWFP Project</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Blanket Supplementary Feeding Program – 4862 (PLW and under 2 years) beneficiaries were reached. Items distributed include CSB+, Vegetable oil and Plumpy Doz respectively. 	



- In Kind General Food Distribution – A total of 62,451 beneficiaries are planned to be reached across the target communities. Items to be distributed include Sorghum, Beans and salt.
- Scale up targeting is ongoing across the 16 target communities
- Ongoing monitoring of 40 beneficiaries across 10 different trades at target locations
- Follow-up on beneficiaries for the formation of VSLA as well as DRC at the LGA.

Gujba LGA- UNWFP Project

- Stakeholder meeting was conducted for the commencement of CBT redemption for the month of August to serve 6,582 households
- Over 18,216 individuals received In-kind food assistant across Ngamma, Buniyadi, Gujba, Katarko and Bunilawanti communities. GFD commodities such Sorghum, Beans, vegetable oil and salt were distributed and the exercise is ongoing for Wagir and Garin Itache communities. A total of 21,597 individuals are expected to be served within the month circle of the distribution.
- Mother to Mother support group meeting was conducted across 3 wards of the BSFP implementing communities in the LGA and will continue to the remaining wards within the month.
- Post distribution monitoring (PDM) was also conducted to monitor the utilization of the distributed supplementary double ration (July and August ration) food distributed in July and there is a plan to change beneficiaries' rations cards in other to check mate forge and other fraud related attitudes by some community members within the month.
- Monitoring of 64 beneficiaries across 10 different trades in ongoing
- Farmers field school training for 110 beneficiaries under Rainfed farming in Gujba and Buni Lawanti completed.
- Follow-up on beneficiaries for the formation of VSLA as well as DRC at the LGA
- A total of 110 beneficiaries received farm inputs in Gujba LGA, the same beneficiaries were enrolled and trained in the farmer field school on best agricultural practices to help improve their farm yield..

Bade LGA



	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CCDRN with support from UNWFP is planning the routine monthly food distribution (in-kind) to 1637 individuals for the month of August. • Ongoing scale up plan to commence card/cash distribution to 7 wards (Lawan Musa, Lawan Fannami, Katuzu, Zango, Azam Kura, Dagona, Sarkin hausawa and Sabon Gari) of the LGA. • Ongoing plan cash out to livelihood beneficiaries • Mother to mother support group meeting was conducted across 4 wards of the BSFP implementing communities in the LGA and will continue to the remaining 2 wards within the month. • Post distribution monitoring (PDM) was also conducted to monitor the utilization of the distributed supplementary double ration (July and August ration) food distributed in July. • Mother to mother support groups formation across four wards (Gwio Kura, Sugum/tagali, Sarkin hausawa and Sabon Gari) completed • Redemption of fresh food voucher: Ongoing planning on the routine monthly food distribution to 6034 PLW and under 2 children across four wards (Gwio Kura, Sugum/tagali, Sarkin hausawa and Sabon Gari) • Food demonstration at ward level. • Lead mothers training. • Tree seedlings transfer to members of support groups • Monitoring of more than 13 VSLA groups across all implementing communities. Three VSLA groups have disbursed loans to their members, some have started paying back. • Training on small ruminants management is ongoing • Routine monitoring of poultry and small ruminants across all implementing communities • Continuation of Distribution of Moringa Seedlings in four communities (Gwio Kura, Sabon Gari, Sarkin Hausawa, and Tagali). 	
<p>6.0</p>	<p>AoB</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Partners were advised to implement inputs distribution (especially seed) at the appropriate time to enable farmer’s plant in good time. ▪ Partners implementing livestock intervention should consider livestock distribution after the rainy season. 	



	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ There is need for coordination among partners to improve efficiency and avoid duplication of effort. ▪ Monthly submission of 5W by partners was reemphasized. ▪ Joint assessment at sector level was proposed ▪ It was agreed that for subsequent meeting, we should make the meeting rotational. Therefore, partners are encouraged to host the sector meeting so that we can also know partners office. However, this is voluntary. ▪ SEMA, DRC and MoA sent their apologies for not attending the meeting ▪ The next meeting will be held at Save the Children office, August 31st 2021.
